## RULES

1. Properly fitted ASTM certified helmets and proper footwear must always be worn when mounted.
2. Numbers must be worn at all times when mounted.
3. Hors Concours will not be allowed.
4. Equestrian Canada Section G (Found [here](#)) rules to apply unless Dwyer Hill Riding Club rules indicate otherwise.
5. Horses and riders are to be properly turned out for their classes. Braiding is encouraged but not mandatory. Jackets must be worn in hunter classes, unless decision has been made by Show Staff and Judge. Show shirts must be tucked into breeches. Jumpers may wear polo's tucked into breeches. Breeches for hunters are to be beige or white in colour. Black or brown boots must be worn. Horses are to be groomed and outfitted in a black or brown English style saddle. Hunters may only have a plain cavesson noseband. Bridles should be black or brown in colour. Bitless bridles but not hackamores are permitted in hunter classes providing the horse is under control.
6. Standing martingales can be worn in the hunter ring, and Running Martingales are allowed in the jumper classes. Boots and wraps are allowed only in the jumper classes.
7. Martingales cannot be worn in under saddle classes.
8. Side and Draw reins will not be permitted during judging. It is acceptable to use them properly in schooling rounds provided a neck strap secures them, or attached to a breastplate, sides of girth, or D rings of saddle.
9. Horses should be sound and healthy for the classes they are entering. (If a horse has a permanent condition that alters their gait/vision etc. without causing discomfort or safety concerns, a veterinary note stating capabilities will be sufficient to allow the horse to compete) If nothing is provided to show staff, the judge has the power to eliminate the horse from the class, with no refunds to be issued.
10. To qualify for year-end awards riders must compete in at least 3 shows in the division they wish to qualify in, excluding the DHRC Hunter Derby.
- 11.8. Abuse will not be tolerated; excessive use of the whip or spurs, sawing on the mouth or anything deemed abuse by show management will result in elimination from that class.
12. If there are more than 12 riders in under saddle classes, only half will canter/gallop at one time.
13. If you are not at the gate and ready to start your class when your number is called, you will be moved to the end of the class, failure to show within 1 minute at the end of the class will result in elimination.
14. In the event of rain, fitted rain coats may be worn over top of show clothing during classes.
15. Whips must be shorter than 75cm.  
\*Courses will be adjusted in the case of wet weather for safety. Delays to start time to ensure safety can happen and will be announced via Facebook and E-mail.  
\*\*Rings will not be held, once Last Call has been announced, we will close the ring and the class will start. No refunds will be given for these cases.
