Book Review The Diary of Macy Allen: In Search of Myself, Ray Hazel

Readers are often fascinated by the story of immigrants coming to our country and the challenges they face when trying to create a new life for themselves. In the book, *The Diary of Macy Allen: In Search of Myself* by Raymond Hazel, readers have the unique experience of a story about a real person that was written using actual diary entries, letters, and writings by the subject herself. Hazel weaves these through his tale of a young girl traveling from Ireland in 1895 towards the promises of a better life in America. The story is about how Macy is forced to traverse the strange world often on her own, or with opposition from society and the adults she encounters. She encounters people who make life difficult for her, but she learns to stand up for herself and trust her own instincts. Through the telling of Macy's life story, sometimes with the input of Macy's own words, the reader experiences her growth, along with the pain and sorrow and the joy and triumphs. Macy Allen is a person worth getting to know.
