Great Northern Tour

The 2021 Great Northern Tour was once again a great time. 43 cars were able to gather on the wonderful back roads thru Wisconsin with slightly more than 80 enthusiastic people along for the ride. This destination of Hayward Wisconsin has now become the fourth time we have visited and each time we have been treated to new and interesting daily destinations. The results of our tour planners hard work have always made this week in Wisconsin a great success. Doug and Deb Persing, Dale and Cindy Pomerleau, John and Linda Pole and Doug and Kim Portlance are the planners, and they spend a lot of time finding the destinations, meals, gas stations and all the other needed items. Our hotel perfectly fit the needs for our breakfasts, lodging and parking lot requirements.

Monday was a travel day with a group leaving from the northern suburbs of Minneapolis and encountering very heavy fog for a good two and half hours of sometimes challenging driving. As we got to Osceola Wisconsin, we picked up some more participants and then got to stop at the ever-popular Burnett Dairy in Grantsburg for ice cream, cheese and other treats. Lunch was a stop at the McKenzie Landing restaurant near Spooner. We gathered even more tourers and then continued to Hayward.

The hotel parking lot was a popular place to see old friends that came from many different areas, We have a Wisconsin group of Model A'ers from a few of the Wisconsin clubs, Southern Minnesota's Lady Slippers Club that always enjoys coming along for the ride. It's exciting to see a parking lot full of Model A's and see who has what and hear stories of their cars, the fixes and the road stories. After the sun sets, we have a social gathering and drivers meeting for the next morning along with snacks, maybe some wine and the making of new acquaintances.

Each morning starts with a blast of an air horn signaling a driver meeting with directions and last minute route changes along with a suggestions on how to keep everyone safe on the roads. The cars start, some have a few glitches and a few experienced mechanics each morning seem to work magic and the reluctant cars either make it to the end of the starting line or catch up soon with the rest of the group.

On our first day we went to the Walt Moss Trucking company where the founder Walt, has a collection of creative vehicles that he has designed and created. These are diesel powered one of a kind creations of his ideas. He works with big equipment and his creations are a reflection of this. They are very detailed with beautiful paint, chrome, and metal work. Next, we drove to the Garmish resort for lunch, a historic classic wood log resort with a lake view and a delicious lunch. This stop has been a favorite request on each of the previous tours. This day was nearly 150 miles of driving!

Day two brought us to the Heritage Canoe Museum and the Train Depot Museum in Spooner. There was a shopping opportunity for those who didn't go to the museums within walking distance. We later had a group lunch of pizza and salad near by and had a nice afternoon drive back to the hotel. That night we had a catered meal served for the group at the hotel.

Day Three was a scenic road trip to Rice Lake to a unique property owned by a man named "Jim". You turned off the road in to a long driveway of a tree covered lane, coming to a covered wooden bridge and then up to beautiful home and a car guys statement of "this is my home". There was a building with some classic cars, a shop and a set up of a "used car" for sale lot, another building of some flat head Ford era cars and oh yeah like a 150 engines as yard art in the center of this complex. all the grounds were freshly mowed and landscaped. Jim was a mechanic and a real engine guy. When we returned to the hotel there was a special group meal. We enjoyed a food truck in the parking lot that was providing smoked and Bar B Que meats in a sampler plate. In normal times they could have catered this in but due to regulations regarding covid precautions this was a work around that the food provider found to deliver his day long preparations of this tasteful meal. It was a wonderful way to end the tour and share some more time with all the participants. There were minor car problems and they got taken care of either on the road (shredded fan belt, flat tire), with minimal down time or in the parking lot. We had the tools and the parts. We also had some veteran tour people who had sorted out their cars before the tour making them reliable and anything we needed seemed to appear from parts carried by some of the group. There was one major car problem, nearly back to the Twin Cities and traveling in a group of four cars we decided to fuel in Oscoela and Doug Portlance got a bad fill of fuel. Within a mile of the station his car had no power, backfired, and couldn't run. His daughter Elaina, who was driving, was able to get it on to a dirt road off the highway.

We determined it was the fuel which had a very strange smell and made two replacement carburetors leak almost immediately. The last carburetor was a recent rebuilt and test run before this problem. The fuel was not colored like gasoline. We had a hose and funnel, and a car was sent back to town and purchased two empty five gallon fuel containers and another smaller container for fuel purchased from another station. We drained the tank as best we could on the un level ground and added fuel. The car ran better but not like it should have for that mile. Since we didn't get all the bad stuff out and had little fuel to put in, we limped the car to another station and filled it. It ran better but not great and since we were near home, Doug Persing was able to get his son in law to come with a trailer and the car was later picked up and Doug Portlance was able to ride home with in another car. This all took nearly three hours of time. With good teamwork everyone helped and made the best of the situation and like the military, we leave no one behind.

With all the miles done, (about 700 from my end of Minneapolis) If there is another tour planned with this group sign me up!.


