This pastor's Corner let's look at some scriptures that apply to us as disciples of Jesus Christ. In Deuteronomy 18:18-19 we read *I will raise up for them a prophet like you from among their fellow Israelites, and I will put my words in his mouth. He will tell them everything I command him. I myself will call to account anyone who does not listen to my words that the prophet speaks in my name.* Going on the scriptures we come to the Transfiguration on the mountain in Matthew, Mark, and Luke

all three gospels record this same event, *Peter said to Jesus, "Lord, it is good for us to be here. If you wish, I will put up three shelters—one for you, one for Moses and one for Elijah." While he was still speaking, a bright cloud covered them, and a voice from the cloud said, "This is my Son, whom I love; with him I am well pleased. Listen to him!"* And in John 2:5 Jesus' mother at the wedding in Cana tells us, "Do whatever he tells you." So here we have scriptures that tell us to listen and to do whatever Jesus tells us to do. So, what does Jesus tell us to do?

First Jesus invites us to *follow him* and become his disciples in Mathew, Mark, Luke, and John. Notice the invitation is to follow not walk beside him or ahead of him but to follow him and to remember his words from John 13:15-17, *I have set you an example that you should do as I have done for you. 16 Very truly I tell you, no servant is greater than his master, nor is a messenger greater than the one who sent him. Now that you know these things, you will be blessed if you do them.*

We are invited in Matthew 11:28-30 "Come to me, all you who are weary and burdened, and I will give you rest. Take my yoke upon you and learn from me, for I am gentle and humble in heart, and you will find rest for your souls. 30 For my yoke is easy and my burden is light."

We are reminded in John 8:12, When Jesus spoke again to the people, he said, "I am the light of the world. Whoever follows me will never walk in darkness but will have the light of life."

We are told in John 14:15-17, "If you love me, keep my commands. And I will ask the Father, and he will give you another advocate to help you and be with you forever— 17 the Spirit of truth. The world cannot accept him because it neither sees him nor knows him. But you know him, for he lives with you and is in you.

In John 11:25 Jesus tells us "I am the resurrection and the life. The one who believes in me will live, even though they die; 26 and whoever lives by believing in me will never die. and asks us question Do you believe this?"

These are just a few of the words of Jesus we should listen to and not forget. I leave you with these words of Jesus from Luke 6:46 and John 20:7 "Why do you call me, 'Lord, Lord,' and do not do what I say? Stop doubting and believe." This Lenten season stop doubting and believe.


