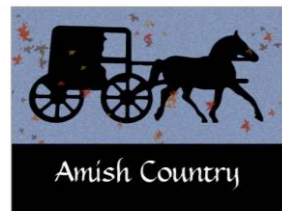
**Monday - September 22<sup>nd</sup>**

You must sign up one day in advance in order for us to order your lunch in time.



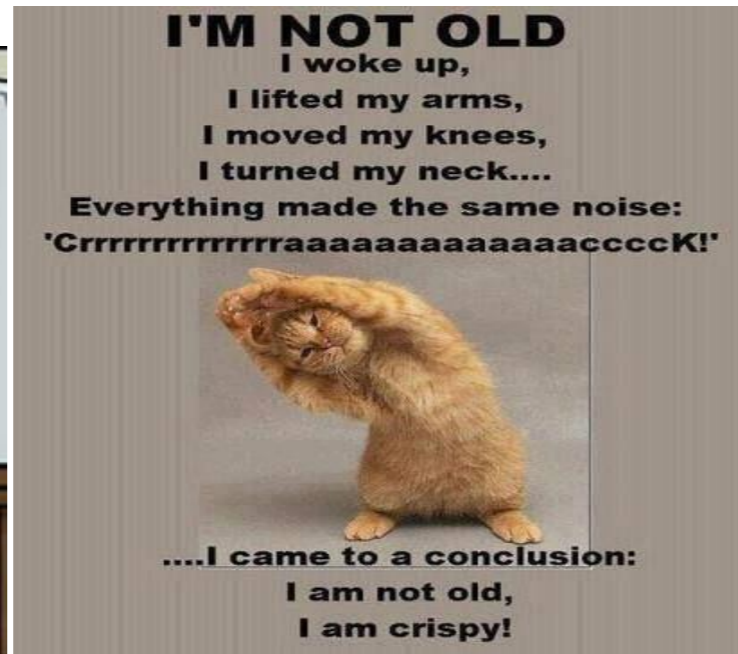

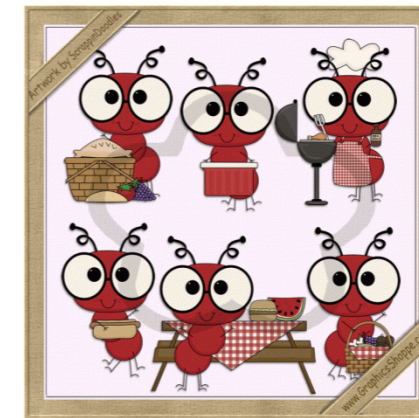
The man, finally resigned to the diagnosis, thanks the vet and asks how much he owes. The vet answers, "\$650."
