In my regular column I thanked all the members who have donated over and above the amount of their renewals. As long as I'm mentioning these donations, I might as well do it again. THANK YOU all you wonderful people who have sent a little extra to tide us over during this awful pandemic. The donations ranged from five dollars to five hundred dollars, and we appreciated EVERY ONE OF THEM. Thank you again, all of you.

Sometime back around the middle of January, I received an informal report that, including all our renewals up to that date, we had only 18 paid memberships. I was also told that in 2020, we had over 50 renewals by that date (the pandemic didn't start here until February, 2020, and didn't really affect us until March). So Lucie Mondani sent out postcard reminders, and Dick Maley and I started email and JMN campaigns to boost our renewals and to solicit donations. We now have over 80 paid memberships; While this is still down from last year's 118 members, we now know that we'll be solvent through the end of the year. Whoopee!

Speaking of the end of the year, we are trying very hard to book bands for dates in September, October, and the Christmas Party in December. Of course, our ability to present concerts is dependent on what Old-man Covid does over the summer, on what rules come to us from the CDC, and most importantly, what Governor deSantis does. Here's hoping.

One last note about donations: one of our members called me to admonish me for publishing the size -- or even approximate size -- donated by each contributor. So I pulled out old programs from similar, although much larger, non-profits like American Stage and the Florida Symphony Orchestra. Sure enough, they list all their donors in brackets just as I did. I guess that's where I picked up the idea.
