It also means keeping green forever the memories of the supreme sacrifices of gallant American patriots, sacrifices necessary to the winnings of wars. It means faithful annual observance of Memorial Day and Veterans Day."

Post 132 continues to operate ever mindful of any and all legalities. Should you become aware of some potential legal problem for the Post, please inform me at your earliest opportunity so it can be addressed.

Finally, remember our mutual commitment to the Preamble to the American Legion Constitution and the Legion's Four Pillars (Veterans Affairs & Rehabilitation; National Security; Americanism; Children & Youth); and most of all remember our commitment to our National Constitution and Country though if you are a veteran, that reminder is normally not necessary. #### STORIES FROM THE 1917 WALL



Suicide among Vets is never easy to discuss, but awareness is essential to reducing Veteran suicides. According to Stop Soldier Suicide, Vets are at 57% higher risk than those who haven't served. As this month's profile attests, even our own Post has been sadly affected by suicide.

William "Bill" Clifford Handley was born in Oklahoma on New Year's Eve 1894, the last of six children born to William & Margaret Handley. The senior William died while Bill was eight years old. The family moved to Orange sometime between 1910 and 1913.

Bill worked at the Ehlen & Grote grocery store at 122 S. Glassell (the space now occupied by Orange Circle Antique Mall). While working at the gas pump in the back of the building, Bill survived a harrowing accident. A motorcyclist had just filled his tank and reportedly lit a cigarette, carelessly tossing the match on the ground. Within moments, the oil storage shed was consumed with flames. According to newspapers, Bill's hair and eyebrows were singed just as he escaped.

When the U.S. entered World War I in April 1917, Bill was living with his mother and sister on Plaza Square (in the apartments above Felix restaurant). He was drafted to the Army installation at Fort Riley, Kansas in November, but was discharged because his mother was dependent on him.

By June 1918, the need for servicemen increased, and Bill was drafted and sent to Ft. McDowell, an Army Recruit Depot on Angel Island near San Francisco. The war ended five months later. Bill was honorably discharged on December 18, 1918.

Bill was an active member of Post 132. He was a delegate to Legion state conventions in Yosemite in 1921

and Eureka in 1923. In 1925, Bill married Clara Browne. Their son Willard was born in 1926.

Major H. G. Upham, commander of Orange post No. 132, American Legion, has named the following delegates to the Legion state convention to be held at Yosemite, August 22, 23 and 24: Arthur Schillings, Jesse W. Russell, William Handley and James Ragan.

But things took a turn for the worse. In 1927 Clara filed suit for divorce against Bill after an altercation that she alleged was violent. Later that year she was granted an interlocutory divorce on grounds of desertion and awarded custody of their son Willard.

#### Suicide Verdict In Nevada Case

LAS VEGAS, Nev., Sept. 11. (U.P.)
—A coroner's jury today held that
William Handley, about 32, of
Orange, Cal., committed suicide.

Handley died yesterday afternoon in the hospital here after he had been found iying by the entrance to an undertaking parlor with a gun wound in his head. The gun was by his side.

He leaves a widow and a threeyear-old son at Orange. He had been working in a restaurant for three weeks. According to the 1930 census, Bill was living in Orange with his brother and working at a rope factory. By August 1931, Bill was in Las Vegas working at a restaurant. On September 10, 1931, he was found lying by the entrance of an undertaking parlor with a gun wound in his head. The gun was by his side. Bill died later the same day in the hospital.

But Bill's legacy to the U.S. armed services wasn't over just yet. In 1934 Clara re-married another WWI Vet from Orange who raised Willard like his own son. And Willard himself served honorably as an Army Private First Class during World War II (he survived the conflict). We thank Bill and his son Willard for their service to our country.
