#### **Tournament News**

#### April Tournament - 5-4-3 Out

The A flight played Chino Creek and B/C flights played Butterfield Stage.

A lot of good scores were turned in and the eventual winners by flight were: (A), Kirk Dancses and Tom Earhart tied at 54. (B), Mike Younger at 49 and (C); Fred Street with an impressive 45.

During the audit, one scorecard was added up 3 strokes off! Please try to review your card and catch these things before you turn in your scorecard. Addition errors will not penalize you but you may finish in a different position than what is posted up on the Scoreboard. This can affect your USGA tournament posting too, and if it is high, you could get a posting penalty. If it is low it stands.

We had good weather and the courses were in good condition. We had 59 players in three flights. You can check out the winners on the results column.

Next month we host a two man Modified Pinehurst so lock in a partner and sign up as early as possible. This month I got some late entries again and it makes it difficult in several ways. First off we have reservations with the course which must be altered at the last minute. Second, it can disrupt the field, pairings, or tee times if it gets to lopsided. If you're late signing up, my only option may be to add you in wherever I can fit you in. I cannot disturb the rest of the field for one late entry. The course does not allow fivesomes in tournaments so it is not an option. Lastly, if you get your entry on time I can nearly always fill your request, but, when its late it is almost impossible to get you in with the group or the time you want. This is especially true in a partner event like the one coming up.

Go ahead, make it easy on yourself, sign up early.

#### Tournament scorecard marking:

- Record only <u>gross scores</u> in the main scoring line. We do not use or need slash net scores on this line since they are not used in tournament skins.
- Only circle <u>real</u> birdies, eagles, and hole in one. (**Do not circle anything else**)
- If we have a tournament where net scores are needed, such as a two man or four man event, we will provide a **net scoring line** specifically for them. Then, generally, I would prefer <u>dots</u> to indicate where the player should take his strokes.
