A Note from Rick: Mother Nature gave us our first taste of winter on Monday and that might have helped sparked a stronger market on Tuesday. Slaughter cattle and cows were both \$4-\$6 higher and the calf market was stronger as well. Feeder prices were unchanged but were not tested to speak of so next weeks feeder sale will be a good test. Thursday's springer sale was a definite test! We had 460 head of springers and that is the biggest number we've had. That being said, I thought the market held up very well. Overall prices were approximately \$50 lower but I felt that was a win with the unexpected number of cattle. There are a lot of heifers on the market coming from herds that have quit milking in the last year or so. When that ends I look for the numbers to shrink somewhat and that might be what it takes to push prices a little higher. The dairy cattle prices have not responded to higher milk prices the way they historically have and I feel there is still an over supply on the market. I see this over supply changing in the next year or so and it will be interesting to see how the market reacts. We have our fall Organic Dairy sale this week and are expecting quite a few cattle to test this market. Hope to see you at TLA!
