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San Pedro Plaza - LEED Certification Only Four Points To Go!

Chief Building Engineer Mark Rybczynski and Building Manager Art Villarreal of Reata Real Estate Services are all smiles as they near LEED Certification at San Pedro Plaza!

Not very long ago, they were all frowns, since most of the energy conserving programs that Mark had presented to management were not acted upon. Even so, Mark knew he could do many cost saving programs that would not require a great expenditure of funds. Then, about two years ago Reata began looking at energy savings and LEED Certification as a companywide goal. They provided qualified personnel to oversee the certification, and before long, Mark's programs were being accepted.

To begin with, he noticed that various areas were not running at comfortable temps and that many areas had wide temp variations. Mark started a systematic inspection of all temperature controls which led to the repair of leaks in his pneumatic system and calibration of all thermostats. He also tackled the lighting systems in the building. Light levels were measured, and many areas were found to have overly high light

levels which allowed for the removal of several light fixtures. He also did a major light fixture retrofit to T-8's, and light switches were changed to motion sensors for added savings.

Mark was actively involved and provided practical and efficient solutions to a number of roadblocks. For example, there was a need for additional stalls in the restrooms. By looking at building blueprints, Mark found ample room was available in the chase areas next to the restrooms. These chase areas had been converted to janitor closets, and by closing them, they were able to convert these under-utilized spaces to the required additional restroom stalls.

Mark is an example of how skills and knowledge of building trades, along with persistence, can result in cost savings of energy and water. He is an inspiration to other SAABE engineers who want to integrate cost saving measures in their buildings. 




December Lunch Summary by Curtis Thompson
