What Are You Growing for God This Summer?

It's an annual ritual. As soon as it's warm enough, my wife surrounds our house with flower pots spilling over with blooms and colorful foliage. But it's a process:

- Select and purchase the plants from Johnson's Nursery no other source will do.
- Buy a few bags of MiracleGro moisture control potting soil no other kind will do.
- Dump the old soil out of the pots (which comes in handy for filling low spots in the yard).
- Realize you need more of the plant saucers that go under the pot. Plan to make another trip to the store.
- Refill the pots with fresh soil, plant the flowers, and water thoroughly over and over again all summer.
- Trim back when they get overgrown, and train running vines onto their trellises.
- Enjoy the color and watch the butterflies, hummingbirds, and bees hovering around them.

We also try planting some vegetables each year — regular and cherry tomatoes, peppers, squash. But our house is a place where vegetable plants go to die. The only luck we have is with herbs. Want some basil? We've got plenty!

And I know the vegetable gardeners (who actually know what they are doing) have their own annual rituals and obsessions when it comes to their gardens.

But what are you growing for God this summer?

Summer may be the perfect time for you to grow a new relationship with someone who needs the love of God in their lives. So...



- Plant a seed by having a conversation.
- Prepare the soil through an act of love or appreciation.
- Nurture growth by finding a way to spend time with them, to get to know them on a deeper level.
- Pray for them, asking God...

"Lord, show me their needs."
"Lord, help me share my story."
"Lord, love them through me."

And maybe you'd like to plant something to make YOU grow...

- Like picking a book of the Bible to read through 2 or 3 times so that you really know its message.
- Like becoming comfortable saying to people, "Can I tell you what God did for me this week?"
- Like picking a person or family in our church you'd like to know better and inviting them to lunch, or to play horseshoes, or to go fishing.

What we harvest in the fall is largely dependent on what we have grown this summer. So wouldn't you like to be busy growing something for God this summer?



Urgent Needs

Right now, our church has **two urgent priorities** in our giving. The Stewardship Committee is asking all of us to unite behind these two top priorities with single-minded commitment.

The first of these is, as always, our church's ministry budget. Without the ministries of our church, and without the ongoing resources of study materials, lights, heating and cooling, ministries to children, teenagers, and adults, we really have no reason to exist. Without these, we don't have a church; we only have a museum that will soon be closed. God has called us to life-changing ministry, which is what our budget helps us accomplish.

The second urgent priority is the repair of our steeple. The picture below shows the rotted wood of the steeple. This damage is allowing large amounts of water to flow into our balcony area every time it rains. The building that previous generations have provided for us is being repeatedly damaged by this hole in the roof that the damaged steeple creates.



If this were our home, we would still pay the mortgage, pay the electric bill, water and sewer, buy food for the family, school supplies, pay doctor bills, etc. But beyond these essentials, we would focus on repairing our roof with urgency.

So that is what we are inviting our whole church family to do. Let's make sure the ministries that are our reason for existing are fully funded, and then, in appreciation for those who have gone before us, but even more in commitment to the Lord, let's tackle this repair project.

The estimate we have received is good for a limited time, so let's take care of this need soon to avoid an increase in repair costs!
