FOOTBALL TIDBITS

The AP Top 10 went 10-0 this past week. It's the first time the AP Top 10 went 10-0 in Week 11 or later since Week 11 of the 2009 season.

Oklahoma has 5 wins when allowing more than 45 points over the last 3 seasons. No other FBS team has more than 1.

Oklahoma also posted its 3rd straight game with 300+ Pass yards and 300+ Rush yards, tied for the 2nd-longest streak by any team over the last 15 seasons.

Oklahoma's Kyler Murray was 6-6 on passes thrown 20+ yards downfield for 156 yards and a TD. The most such completions in a game this season by an FBS QB is 7 (done 3 times). Kyler Murray started 11-11, his most consecutive completions to start a game in his career.

Alabama shut out an AP-ranked opponent in consecutive games for the first time in school history.

With 227 passing yards, Dwayne Haskins moved into 2nd on the Ohio State single-season passing yards list. He passed J.T. Barrett and Bobby Hoying in Ohio State's win at Michigan State and he is now just 51 yards shy of setting the single-season school record.

Florida became the fourth SEC team with multiple 17-point comebacks in a season over the last 15 seasons, joining 2016 Tennessee, 2011 Arkansas and 2010 Auburn.

UCF has scored at least 30 points in 22 consecutive games, which is tied for the 3rd-longest streak in the AP Poll Era (since 1936). The two longer streaks belong to South Florida (24 straight, 2015-2017) and Oregon (23 straight, 2011-2012).

Drew Lock had 158 pass yards to bring his career total to 11,247. That moves him into 3rd on the all-time SEC list behind Aaron Murray (13,166) and David Greene (11,528). He passed Chris Leak (11,213), Peyton Manning (11,201) and Eric Zeier (11,153) in Missouri's win over Vanderbilt.

#13 Syracuse beat Louisville 54-23 this past Friday, which was its 5th 50-point game this season. Only Alabama has more such games in the FBS this season. The previous Syracuse school record for 50-point games in a season had been 3.

The following is why THE BLITZ is all for the Southeastern Conference going to a 9 game conference schedule:

The Citadel at Alabama; Liberty at Auburn; Idaho at Florida, Massachusetts at Georgia, Middle Tennessee State at Kentucky, Rice at LSU, Chattanooga at South Carolina and LIAB at Texas A&M

Those are the games that are being played by 8 of the 14 SEC members this Saturday. Anyone who has been a regular reader of THE BLITZ knows how we felt when the conference expanded from 12 to 14 schools but did not increase the number of conference games being played every season. Currently, the Big 12, the Big Ten and the Pac-12 are the three "Power 5" conferences that do play 9 conference games while the ACC & SEC have remained at 8 league games. Let's be totally transparent here. The ACC and SEC have not expanded from 8 to 9 conference games because they don't want additional losses that would inevitably knock 6-6 teams down to 5-7 and miss out on a bowl game. Another thing is the scheduling of so many FCS schools. These essentially equate to an automatic win but the fans don't want to watch these sacrificial lambs on their schools' schedules. Right now ACC & SEC schools can go 2-6 in conference play, go 4-0 vs non-conference competition and end up in a bowl game. A huge majority of these non-conference games are home games which also helps. Playing 8 conference games in the ACC & SEC means that a school will only face 2 opponents from the opposite division in the regular season each year. It's time to go to 9 conference games.

NOTRE DAME VS SYRACUSE



The undefeated Notre Dame Fighting Irish (10-0) will travel to the Bronx in New York City to take on the surprising Syracuse Orange (8-2) in a game that was originally scheduled to showcase Notre Dame football in a unique setting at Yankee Stadium II. That is still the case but both of these squads have exceeded expectations to add more spice to this game. Kickoff is at 2:30 PM EST and will be televised on NBC.

There are so many people who are doubting Notre Dame but here they are sitting pretty with an undefeated record and heading towards the playoffs if they can beat Syracuse this week and at Southern California on November 24th. The Irish have beat some good teams so far in 2018 (Michigan, Stanford, Pitt and Northwestern) and Syracuse will be a another challenge. Some people think that Notre Dame should be punished because they don't have to play in a conference championship game. Our opinion is that the Irish did not this year and have NEVER played a weak FCS school to pad their won-loss record so we're okay with Notre Dame making the College Football Playoff Field.

Notre Dame leads the all-time series vs Syracuse 5-3-0. The Orange won the only other time these two met in the Bronx. In 1963 (at the original Yankee Stadium) Syracuse beat Notre Dame 14-7. They did play in 2014 and 2016 just across the river in New Jersey at MetLife Stadium, where the Irish came away with two convincing victories. Ian Book is supposed to be ready to play after missing the Florida State game. If he is close to 100%, we think he's the difference maker. We're taking Notre Dame to win 38-28.

GAMES IN WHICH THE #1 RANKED TEAM IN THE AP POLL WAS DEFEATED OR TIED (1936-2017)

The Associated Press college football poll has been around since 1936. In that span, the #1 ranked team has either lost or has been tied 148 times. Below we list all 148 games when the #1 team has either lost or has been tied. Of those 148 games, 30 were in a bowl game (9 in the Sugar Bowl, 6 in the Orange Bowl, 5 in the Rose Bowl, 2 in the Cotton Bowl, 2 in the Fiesta Bowl, 4 in the BCS National Championship Game & 2 in the College Football Playoff Championship Game). Four #1 ranked teams have lost in conference bowl, 2 in the Presid Bowl, 4 in the BCS National Championship Game & 2 in the College Problem Playon Championship Games and another 9 lost in regular season games played at neutral sites while 1 regular season neutral game site contest ended in a tie. Out of the 148 spoilers, 46 were unranked opponents at the time the game was played while the other 102 spoilers were ranked at game time. The #1 team has lost 20 games to opponents that were ranked #2 prior to the game while being tied 2 times by the #2 team. Out of these 148 games, the #1 team came away with a loss in 135 of those games and on 13 occasions was tied. Of the 148 losses or ties only 34 of the losses and 5 of the ties came when the #1 ranked team was playing in their home stadium.

Below are the results of all 148 games in which the #1 team the AP Poll lost or was tied. We list the date, the winning team and their pre-game ranking, the result, the #1 team that was beaten or tied, the score and the site if it was not on campus. The home team or if the game was played at a neutral site is listed in bold.


