is built and ready for interior finishes. I anticipate that Starbucks will start soon as they work with Phillips Edison to complete the terms of the lease. There have already been several showings to interested businesses for the remaining units. A broker's open house has also been scheduled. I am happy to say that there is also interest in the existing Shoregate Plaza building and a business that is close to signing a lease in an open space. This is great news for Willowick. I know it's the start to more business here.

I want to congratulate Todd Shannon from the Service Department. Todd was hired as Service Director in September. Previously Todd was our Road Department Foreman. He has been with the City of Willowick since 2002 and is also retired military. His experience and work ethic make him a great asset to Willowick. Please congratulate him when you see him.

Don't forget to vote. November 2nd is the General Election. Willowick has a couple of issues on the ballot. Issue 3 is a 0.5 Mill Renewal Levy for parks and recreational purposes. This levy brings in approximately \$60,000

for our Parks and Recreation Department. It was originally adopted in 1986 and still collects the same amount it has for 35 years. This is a renewal so it will not increase your property tax nor does it increase as your property value increases.

Issue 4 is a Proposed Charter Change. This would change the process to change zoning in the City of Willowick. This would make the process faster for a business that may want to locate their business to Willowick. This would allow Willowick to be competitive in having new business locate here. The business market today is much different than the past. Retail businesses are changing every year as delivery services and online retail continue to take over the market. When the right type of business presents itself to Willowick we need to be prepared to take action. Please call if you have any questions regarding this issue.

I also encourage you to go the county web site and see all the ballot issues that are being voted on for the county. You can see a sample ballot on the Board of Election page. It is important to go to the polls educated on the issues.

Hi Everyone,

I would like to remind dog owners of The Lake County Dog Laws:

The Ohio Revised Codes specifies that all dogs must be kept confined to the owners property or under reasonable control at all times. This applies to all areas of Ohio, urban or rural. Municipalities may have additional regulations regarding dog control within their own areas, so we suggest you check with your local zoning department. This law was made as a courtesy to all citizens of the state for safety reasons. A dog owner is held responsible for both personal injury and property damage done by their dog.

Per the Lake County General Health District, a licensed veterinarian must vaccinate all dogs against the rabies virus. Rabies can be contracted by any warm-blooded animal, including man and is almost always fatal. Immunizing your pet help to prevent the spread of the disease.

All dogs three months of age and older must be licensed immediately according to state law. New dog licenses are sold during the annual renewal period between December 1 and January 31. Dogs acquired after January 31 must be licensed immediately to avoid penalty fees. Licensing is a requirement of Ohio law, and the current dog license attached to your dog's collar will identify you as the owner should the dog become lost. Anyone finding a dog with a license on it can call the Sheriff's Department if our office is closed and get owner information. You will be notified if your dog is actually impounded by the Dog Warden's office and is wearing its current license.

Dogs not wearing their current license are held only three days for reclamation. Under Ohio law, each stray must be held for 72 hours prior to adoption, while

I want to bring up issue 4 again which will be on the ballot this November. Issue 4 will be on the ballot in November for ALL Willowick residents to vote on. The City is seeking to do away with referendum zoning which means a yes vote at the ballot on Issue 4 will do away with referendum zoning. The benefits of voting yes on Issue 4 are that businesses that want to establish themselves in Willowick and need to change the zoning of the property they want to use, can move in quicker without the zoning change having to go to the ballot.

I've answered a few questions on Facebook from residents and the one question that comes up most frequently is whether doing away with referendum zoning will allow businesses to move into areas zoned single family or multi-family. The answer is ABSOLUTELY NOT!! Like most cities, Willowick has a comprehensive zoning plan which includes a zoning map that identifies the zoning districts of the city. If a business were to submit an application for a zoning change in a residential area, the Planning Commission would deny the application outright, due to the fact that allowing a business to move into a residential area does not follow the comprehensive zoning plan as it is shown on the zoning map.

If you have questions or comments about referendum zoning, please contact your Council representative, Mayor Regovich or Monica Drake. Contact info can be found on the city website or call City Hall at 440-585-3700.

Aid and Attendance Benefit: A Little Known Veterans Resource

While it is not as well-known as many other military benefits, the VA Aid and Attendance benefit provides much needed assistance to individuals who require the regular care of another person to help with bathing, meal preparation, dressing, medication monitoring and other activities of daily living. This tax-free benefit is provided by the Department

of Veterans Affairs and may be available to Veterans and their surviving spouses who live in assisted living communities, residential care homes and those receiving personal in-home care.

To qualify, a Veteran must have served at least 90 days of consecutive active-duty service. He or she must have been discharged with any

type of discharge other than a dishonorable discharge. They must also have served one day of active duty during wartime to be eligible for this benefit. Also eligible are Reservist or National Guard Veterans activated during wartime for 90 days and surviving spouses of Veterans if married at the time of their Veteran's death.

Eligible Veterans must be age 65 or older or totally disabled or a resident or patient in a skilled nursing facility due to loss of mental or physical abilities or getting Social Security Disability Insurance or Supplemental Security Income. For a surviving spouse, there is no age requirement.

As of July 1, 2021, the maximum Aid and Attendance Benefits are as follows:

Veteran: up to \$1936/month.
Surviving spouse: up to \$1244/month

Married veteran: up to \$2295/month

Married veteran couple: up to \$3071/month

Proof of the need for assistance with activities of daily living is required. Certain income qualifications also apply, however most unreimbursed expenses such as insurance premiums, the cost of assisted living, nursing home, or in-home care can help reduce the counted income. Other qualifications may apply but each case is decided on the facts of the individual's circumstances.

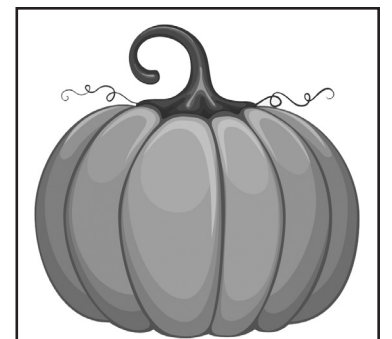

Lake Humane Society Expands Cpl Joshua Harmon Pets to Vets Program

Lake Humane Society has expanded the Cpl Joshua Harmon Pets to Vets program by partnering with Veteran Canine Connection, a local nonprofit organization that connects Veterans with companion dogs. Dog trainers, who use positive reinforcement methods, will help choose a shelter dog from Lake Humane Society that is a good fit for the Veterans they are working with. The dog will be adopted to the Veteran and then go through a 5-week training program. Not only is the training program beneficial to the Veteran, the likelihood of a dog being returned to Lake Humane Society for behavioral reasons will be extremely low.

Veteran Canine Connection will pay the adoption fee, supply 1-year of flea, tick and heartworm medications, provide veterinary care for the first year of the adoption and conduct the training at no cost to the Veteran.

"We are so excited to begin our partnership with Lake Humane

Society. They are the first shelter to offer us a real commitment to help us to find the right dogs for our Veteran applicants. With their help, we hope to expand our presence in greater Cleveland and the surrounding communities. Together we will have the opportunity to meet the needs of our great Veterans by connecting them with shelter animals and ultimately enhance the lives of both the Veterans and their dogs.", said Joan Tiefel, Director of Veteran Canine Connection.

The Cpl Joshua Harmon Pets to Vets program is part of a compassionate mission to protect animals and build connections between pets and people through advocacy and education. Cpl Joshua Harmon was a U.S. Army Soldier assigned to the 25th Light Infantry Division (nicknamed Tropic Lightning), 35th Infantry Regiment, 2nd Battalion. He served as a Combat Medic attached to the Scouts Sniper Platoon and received the Army

Medal of Commendation of Valor for performing extraordinary life-saving measures. Additionally, Cpl Harmon was awarded the Combat Medical Badge and is a Bronze Star recipient.

Joshua was deployed to Kirkuk, Iraq on August 5, 2006, serving in Operation Iraqi Freedom. When returning from a mission on August 22, 2007, Joshua, along with thirteen fellow soldiers, lost their lives when their UH-60 Black Hawk helicopter crashed in Multaka, outside of Kirkuk. Joshua was a Class of 2005, Mentor High School graduate and a devoted husband to the love of his life Kristin (Rathjen) Harmon. The Pets to Vets program was named after Joshua because of his lifelong love of animals.

"This partnership is a win-win for everyone. Our shelter dogs will find loving homes and Veterans will have a new companion animal that shows them unconditional love. We know that pets help alleviate loneliness, bring comfort and reduce anxiety. We are proud to be working with Veteran Canine Connection and excited to enhance the Cpl Joshua Harmon Pets to Vets program", said Lori Caszatt,

Interim Executive Director at Lake Humane Society.

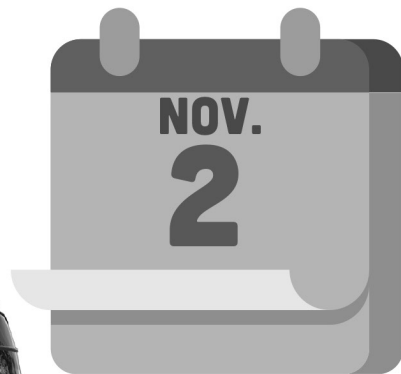

Financial Aid Applications are Now Open for Those Who Plan to Attend College in Fall 2022

Students who plan to start college in fall of 2022 can begin to fill out the FAFSA (Free Application for Federal Student Aid) beginning, Friday, Oct. 1, 2021. Applying early has its benefits as early applicants typically have a better chance to qualify for more grants. There are many forms of financial aid available – both state and federal – as well as scholarships. Regardless of which form of aid

the student wishes to receive, all are processed using the information provided by students and their parents in the FAFSA.

Once the FAFSA form is filled out, many students and their parents may still not be clear about the next steps. Because financial aid paperwork and jargon can be confusing, Lakeland offers "Verification + (Plus)," a service for enrolled students that provides one-on-one attention from a

staff member who will steer the student through the process to finalize and determine eligibility for financial aid.

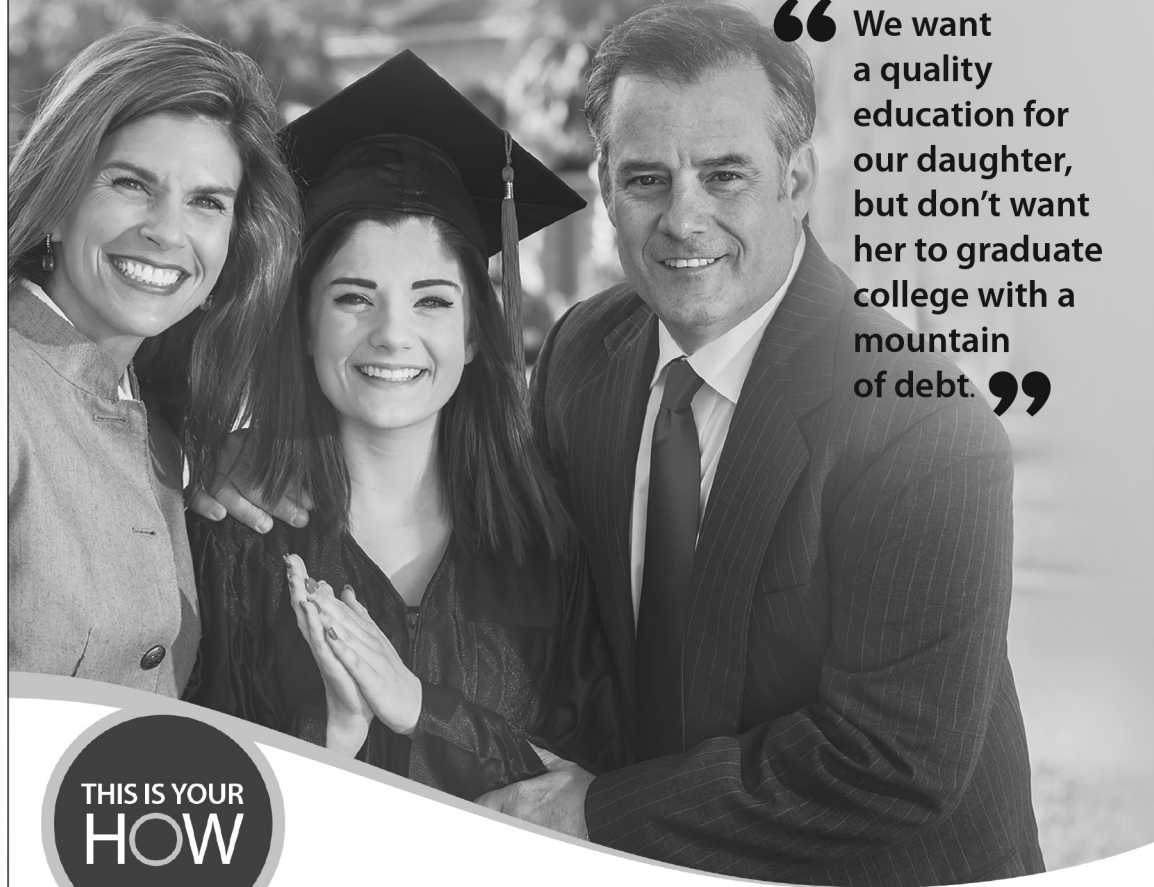
