Why: To be safe on the water.


To qualify you for your *WA State Boater's Card*. It is now required for anyone born after January 1, 1955 who will be operating a 15+ horsepower engine. It is also a good idea to carry this card if you plan to travel by boat into Canada as they require proof of a boat operator's competency, and this certificate meets Canada's requirement. Some boating insurance companies offer reduced premiums to cardholders as well. Receive the added benefit of the option of a 6-month trial membership to the US Power Squadron after taking this class.

Marine Electrical Systems Class Offered

Course Description: Defines electricity, discusses hands-on boat wiring, and explains DC and AC electrical systems and galvanic and stray current corrosion, outlines lightning protection guidelines, and the final classroom session will describe troubleshooting boat electrical problems. The class will also include detailed instructions on how to: 1) use a multi-meter, 2) solder and crimp electrical wiring circuits, and 3) read electrical wiring diagrams. This course is designed for boat owners to learn how to properly maintain their boat's electrical systems.


A discount is offered to family members who will be sharing a textbook. Squadron members' tuition will be discounted as well.

Decal Awareness Program (DAP)



There is a new replacement tool in the Vessel Safety Check (VSC) tool box called "DAP"-acronym for "Decal Awareness Program". The flyers and posters were designed to display the three primary aspects of the United States Power Squadrons: EDUCATION, SAFETY, and CAMARADERIE. Using the Vessel Safety Check decal at its nucleus is beneficial; since it is a recognizable symbol. Another benefit of the flyer is Squadrons and VEs can add their contact information electronically from their computer. Also displayed on the flyer is the Quick Response (QR) code for the USPS web site, plus a QR code for the United States Coast Guard Auxiliary VSC locater web site. This is a new National project that adheres to the USPS branding manual policy.


"Save a Life" boater safety signs were designed to be placed at recreational merchant locations and boat ramps. By including the Form 7012, boaters will know in advance what is expected in order to pass a VSC. One of the signs is designed to have a Squadron address box and the other is a Universal sign that combines the USPS and USCGAUX.

With your leadership and support, the Decal Awareness Program can increase the number of annual Vessel Safety Checks.



- 2 Dec At dusk, Venus is 3 finger-widths to the moon's left.
- 3 Dec Venus is 3 finger-widths below the moon tonight. Mars is 1½ fist-widths to the moon's upper left. Altair, part of the Summer Triangle, is 2½ fist-widths to the moon's upper right.
- 4 Dec Mars is less than 3 finger-widths to the moon's left. With binoculars, see if you can spot iota Capricorni, ½ finger-width to the right of Mars.
- 5 Dec Mars is 3 finger-widths to the moon's lower right.
- 6 Dec Fomalhaut, in the constellation Pisces, is 2 fist-widths below the moon tonight.
- 11 Dec The Pleiades Cluster is 1 fist-width to the moon's left late tonight, and Capella is 3 fist-widths beyond the Pleiades. Aldebaran is 1½ fist-widths to the moon's lower left. Mercury is at its greatest elongation, 20.8 degrees, east of the sun and sets 1 hour 21 minutes after the sun.
- 12 Dec Separated by a finger-width, the moon and Aldebaran rise a half hour before sunset, growing closer until the moon occults Aldebaran five hours later.
- 13 Dec Several first-magnitude stars surround the moon late tonight. Aldebaran is 1½ fist-widths to the moon's upper right, Betelgeuse is 1 fist-width to the lower right, Procyon is 3 fist-widths below or to the lower left, Pollux is 2 fist-widths to the upper left of Procyon, and Capella is 3 fist-widths to the moon's upper left.
- 15 Dec Late tonight, the moon is midway between Procyon to the lower right and Pollux to the upper left.
- 17 Dec Regulus is 3 finger-widths to the moon's lower left at midnight.
- 18 Dec Regulus is less than 2 finger-widths to the moon's upper left before dawn.
- 20 Dec Before dawn the last-quarter moon is midway between Regulus, 2 fist-widths to the upper right, and Jupiter, to the lower left. Spica is 2 finger-widths to Jupiter's lower left.
- 21 Dec Today marks the first day of winter as the sun reaches its greatest southerly declination at 1044 UT and begins its 6-month journey north.
- 22 Dec This morning, Jupiter is 1 finger-width to the moon's lower left, and Spica is less than 3 finger-widths beyond Jupiter.
- 23 Dec Jupiter and Spica lay to the moon's right this morning.
- 24 Dec The equation of time is zero. Local mean time and sundial time are the same.
- 31 Dec In the early evening, Venus is 1½ fist-widths to the moon's upper left, and Mars is another fist-width beyond Venus.
