Book Club Gathering


Everyone is welcome to join book club discussions on the fourth Tuesday of the month. We are meeting on **March 26 at 1:30 pm** at Margaret Deveraux Jefferies' house (262 NE 18th Ave, Hillsboro). Our backup location is Calvary's library.

You do not need to have finished the book to join the discussion. Just be aware that often the questions have spoilers. Please feel free to join us for fellowship if you haven't read the book.

March's book is *The Tattooist of Auschwitz* by Heather Morris. It is biographical and historical fiction. The public library has 23 book copies, 12 large print editions, 4 Audiobook CD sets, 8 downloadable Audiobooks, and 3 eBooks. Margaret will lead the discussion.

The publisher's description:

In April 1942, Lale Sokolov, a Slovakian Jew, is forcibly transported to the concentration camps at Auschwitz-Birkenau. When his captors discover that he speaks several languages, he is put to work as a Tätowierer (the German word for tattooist), tasked with permanently marking his fellow prisoners. Imprisoned for more than two and a half years, Lale witnesses horrific atrocities and barbarism--but also incredible acts of bravery and compassion. Risking his own life, he uses his privileged position to exchange jewels and money from murdered Jews for food to keep his fellow prisoners alive. One day in July 1942, Lale, prisoner 32407, comforts a trembling young woman waiting in line to have the number 34902 tattooed onto her arm. Her name is Gita, and in that first encounter, Lale vows to somehow survive the camp and marry her. A vivid, harrowing, and ultimately hopeful re-creation of Lale



Sokolov's experiences as the man who tattooed the arms of thousands of prisoners with what would become one of the most potent symbols of the Holocaust, The Tattooist of Auschwitz is also a testament to the endurance of love and humanity under the darkest possible conditions.

Coming **April 23:** *The Daughter's Walk, A Novel* by Jane Kirkpatrick is historical and Christian fiction based closely on real people and real events.

Nineteen-year-old Clara Estby is hauled by her mother, Helga, on a 7,000-mile walk from Spokane, Wash., to New York in 1896. The fashion industry is looking for promotion of the new, shorter dress for women; Helga is looking for a cash prize to save the family farm from foreclosure ... and Clara dreams of becoming a businesswoman.

During the Annual Congregational meeting in January, someone asked about Calvary's current mortgage balance. On February 5, the balance was \$16,970.75. The monthly payment is \$1009.00, and the interest rate is 4.25%. Continuing this payment schedule, the mortgage should be paid off by early 2025.

Audit Committee has had one meeting with our insurance carrier and have a second meeting scheduled for next week. Once they have completed this, they will give their report and recommendations to the council.

We are looking for someone who might be interested in being the Treasurer. Dave Moore would like to step back from this responsibility. It is a volunteer position. If you are interested, please talk to me or Pastor Rachel.

The search for a new Office Manager is underway. In the meantime, the council authorized that the temporary/interim (me) be compensated based on the 2024 budget allocation. It is much appreciated.

I hope you have taken time to read, enjoy, and contemplate the gifts that we see in Pastor Rachel. Perhaps you see some of these gifts in yourself or others or see something you would like to strive toward. I see them in you.
