
APRIL 13 & 14, 2024 THIRD SUNDAY OF EASTER

It opened their understanding. (Luke 24, 45)

The disciples had just experienced three traumatic days: The Last Supper, the Garden of Gethsemane, the betrayal of Judas, the arrest of Jesus, the betrayal of Peter and finally the Crucifixion of Jesus. Everything they had staked their lives on had been shattered into pieces, and they had completely failed Jesus.

Therefore, it is not surprising that Jesus' first words when he appeared to the disciples were "Peace be with you" (Luke 24, 36). How much they needed that peace! Then, just as he had done with the disciples at Emmaus, he "opened their understanding" to help them understand everything they had just experienced (24, 45). He reviewed the Scriptures with them and showed them how his death had been part of God's plan all along. He helped them see that what had happened was not a tragedy but a triumph. It was not the end of all his hopes, but the beginning of a new and glorious future.

Have you ever felt how the disciples felt? Perhaps, you are going through a painful situation right now that makes you feel confused, betrayed or lost. Maybe a traumatic experience from the past still haunts you. Or perhaps the guilt of some past sin continues to weigh on you.

Whatever your situation, Jesus wants to do for you what he did for his disciples. He longs to open understanding to His mercy so that you can be freed from guilt or shame. The Lord wants to show you His love so that you can see your past—especially the painful parts—through His eyes of love and compassion. Jesus wants to offer you a new vision of his wisdom, so that you can see your future with hope and confidence.

Quiet your heart today, so you can hear Jesus speak to you. Allow him to "open your understanding" and show you how he looks at you; He allows me to give you his peace.

"Lord Jesus, help me to see through your eyes, to listen with your ears and to love with your heart, I pray."

BECOMING SAINTS...RAISING SAINTS

"When we face the sun, we get a tan...but when we stand before Jesus in the Eucharistic, we become Saints." This is one of my favorite quotes from Blessed Carlo Acutis. Maybe because being on the beach and feeling the sun on my face is something that I love to do. If our life plan is to be saints, what better way to stand before Jesus in the Eucharist and feel his light entering into our bodies and transforming us. I imagine the image of a host radiating its light from the Father, through the Holy Spirit, to the Body of Christ. The image reaches out to me, with a power that invites me into the mystery of the ongoing Real Presence of Jesus Christ in my life every day through the Eucharist.

This April, many of our families are celebrating their children's First Holy Communion. And what better time to explain and continue reinforcing in them the Real Presence of Jesus in the Eucharist. When Pope St. Pius X lowered the age for First Holy Communion from twelve to the age of discretion (around seven) in his 1910 Quam Singulari, he expressed his hope that children who have received First Holy Communion would be regularly admitted to the Holy Table, to be embraced by Christ, preserved from corruption, and nourished by the food of interior life. During the transubstantiation, the bread and wine used for Communion become Body and Blood of Jesus Christ. Indeed, the Catholic Church teaches that "the Eucharist is 'the source and summit of the Christian life.'"

Various studies in recent years have revealed a disturbing fact: less than half of people who identify as Catholics believe in the Real Presence.

In 2019, a Pew research Center survey found that 69% of Americans Catholics believe that, in the Mass, the bread and wine "are symbols of the Body and Blood of Jesus Christ." Only 31% believe in the Catholic doctrine that states that, upon consecration, "the bread and wine actually become the Body and Blood of Jesus." One of the hopes of the National Eucharistic Revival is that it will foster recognition and devotion to Our Lord, who gives himself to us in the Blessed Sacrament, not only in today's catholic adults, but in our children as well.

It can be difficult concept to teach to children (and adults). It is challenging to teach a mystery, perhaps because, in reality, we don't teach mystery; we invite others to encounter it and experience it. Certainly, as parents, we are responsible for predisposing our children to receive the sacrament, ensuring that they have a concept and understanding of what they are about to receive. However, we don't teach the real Presence of the Eucharist like we teach a mathematical or another language. Rather, we prepare them to see with their hearts. You don't have to offer any theology; instead you predisposed your children to enter into a mysterious encounter through which they would receive the greatest gift imaginable—the very presence of God within us!

Just as John tells us in the Gospel 1: 45-46: Philip found Nathanael and told him, "We have found the one about whom Moses wrote in the law, and also the prophets, Jesus, son of Joseph, from Nazareth." But Nathanael said to him, "Can anything good come from Nazareth? Philip said to him, "Come and see."

Carlo began to review on a website, all the Eucharistic miracles in the world. His love for the Eucharist led him to investigate 136 miracles, which he included in his virtual museum. Being a child like any other, who liked soccer and video games, he wanted the whole world to know that the Eucharist had incredible power. When you go to mass next Sunday, keep in mind that the Eucharist is not just a symbol. The Eucharist is Jesus. The same Jesus who rose from the dead.
