The UC Merced College Advising Corps Scholars was launched in 2018 as the 25th chapter of the College Advising Corps (CAC) with the vision of making college a viable option for all students and increasing the college-going rates for partner schools and districts in the San Joaquin Central Valley. The UC Merced CAC Scholars Program works in collaboration with partner schools and college student academic preparation programs to offer supplemental college access and preparation efforts for all students using research-based best practices. The UC Merced CAC Scholars Program provides comprehensive college advising, awareness, and preparation resources and services through the efforts of a dedicated College Fellow.

UC Merced CAC Scholars Program - College Fellows:

- Under the direction and purview of a full-time Project Director, an employee of UC Merced and experienced manager in student academic preparation programs, will learn the theory and receive mentoring and field experiences in college access and preparation, public education, student, parent, and district-centered services;
- Will be placed at select partner high schools in the counties of Stanislaus, Merced, and Madera;
- Will be assigned to a new or existing partner high school served by another CEP program;
- Will participate in local and national research and data collection as specified by state and federal agreements, including the
 provision of intensive program activities using evidence-based best practices of highly successful college access programs and
 strategies that build college going cultures through individual, small group, classroom, and whole school efforts;
- Will be responsible for data collection, entry, tracking, and analysis of student and whole-school services. The UC Merced CAC Scholars Program is a student centered and data driven organization; and
- Will implement the following best practice program efforts and activities: recruit and mentor a high school students in specific grade levels; support partner school sites' school-wide college preparation; and provide students with college access and preparation assistance, such as academic advising, college admissions applications, financial aid applications, scholarship applications and higher entrance exams preparation/registration.

The UC Merced CAC Scholars Program is committed to providing high quality services to students and improving outcomes for college access through an ongoing cycle of continuous improvement. This approach requires data collection, analysis, and decision-making based on progress towards goals. College Fellows will rely on a formative assessment to learn what is effective or not within the context of their assigned schools. As such, regular data collection, entry and analysis is an essential function of each College Fellow. A Project Director will oversee day-to-day program efforts and activities and provide College Fellows with training and guidance in meeting the requirements of the program and professional development to promote leadership, careers in public service, research, and graduate school.

Monthly Living Allowance, Year-End Award and Health Care Coverage:

- \$2,610 monthly living allowance for a 10-month term; August through May
- Up to a \$4,000 Year-End Award upon successful completion of two terms ((2) 10-month 1,700 hours)

Eligibility Requirements:

- 1. Must be a recent college graduate. (earned a BA/BS earned in 2017 or 2018)
- 2. Prior experience working with middle and/or high school students; college access/outreach programs; and/or urban public schools ranging from small charter schools to large comprehensive high schools preferred; interest in putting theory into practice and using data and evaluation techniques to continuously improve program.
- 3. Genuine interest in increasing educational opportunities for youth and creating a college going culture in schools.
- 4. Must be available from August 1, 2018 through May 31, 2019; Monday through Friday, 8:00 am 5:00 pm; some evening and weekend trainings/events (varies by region and site placement).
- 5. Ability to demonstrate initiative and work independently.
- 6. Ability to travel locally, state-wide, and nationally; ability to travel to and from school sites. (Access to a reliable car highly preferred)
- 7. Ability to relocate to region of placement.
- 8. Fellowship is contingent upon successful completion of the criminal background check (FBI, DOJ, Dru Sjodin).

Application Process: Recruitment will be ongoing and selected applicants will be offered an interview.

University of California, Merced- College Advising Corps Scholars FREQUENTLY ASKED QUESTIONS (2018-19)



1. What does it mean to be a CAC Scholars College Fellow?

The UC Merced CAC Scholars Program provides College Fellows with an opportunity to gain experiential learning through significant hands-on field experience in education and college advising and access. Fellows receive training, professional development, supervision, and coaching to provide low-income, first-generation high school students college preparation services and resources. The appointment is a full-time assignment at a high school located in the San Joaquin Central Valley.

The UC Merced, Center for Educational Partnerships provides direct oversight of the CAC Scholars Program and has a strong commitment to public service and a culture that promotes and delivers outstanding service to high school students to increase their college readiness, access, and success. As a College Fellow the fellow will be required to abide by the established professional standards and minimum service requirements must be met. The UC Merced CAC Scholars Project Director will provide College Fellow feedback on his/her performance twice a year. The service term for the fellowship is 10 months, beginning August 1, 2018 and ending May 31, 2019. Only College Fellows who meet expectations/performance standards will be invited back for a second 10-month term.

2. What are some benefits and challenges?

Benefits

- Amazing opportunity to work in-depth with and impact the lives of first-generation and low-income high school students.
- Opportunity to work in a community that may reflect your own experience.
- Multiple professional development opportunities. (See #3 for more information)
- Ongoing coaching and support from Regional Managers and/or Coordinators at the CEP.
- Opportunity to significantly build resume, competencies, and skills.
- Networking opportunities with K-12 educators and administrators, non-profit professionals and higher education professionals and policy makers.
- Staff have been offered positions at partner high schools, Community Based Organizations, community colleges, and 4 year universities.
- Up to 6 to 8 hours a month for graduate and career exploration or to complete graduate school applications; the UC Merced CAC Scholars Program will provide a minimum of two workshops or panels per semester.

Challenges

- Training days can be long but are informative and rich in content.
- Managing time to complete service requirements, complete data entry, and meet the needs/requests of site partners.
- o Completing multiple projects with competing deadlines.
- College Fellows may have limited funds for student activities.
- Working evening and weekend events when necessary.
- o Providing classroom guidance.
- Working with high-need student populations that require a lot of high-quality support, assistance, and resources in order to meet their potential.
- Complex school environments and political dynamics.
- A significant amount of data entry and documentation of services is required of College Fellows.
- O College Fellows must be flexible and may have to adjust hours. There are peak seasons during the school year when College Fellows will increase their service hours to meet the needs of students. For example, October through November, College Fellows may complete more than 40 service hours a week.

3. What types of training and professional events are required for the College Fellows?

College Fellows are expected to attend:

- Trainings by the University of California Merced, Center for Educational Partnerships, and the College Advising Corps (CAC) Program: four-week CACS College Advising Institute in August (includes training sessions provided by experts in education and youth development and customized trainings provided by Regional Managers and Coordinators), a one to two-day mid-year training, year-end training, and the CAC National Adviser Summit (this summit takes place in the fall semester in Washington DC every other year and at a CAC chapter area on alternating years).
- Statewide Trainings in Local Region: UC Counselor Conference, CSU Counselor Conference, and the California Student Aid Commission FAFSA and Cal Grant Training.
- Region Specific Trainings: College Board Counselor Conference, ACT High School Counselor Conference, additional conferences/professional development as determined by the Project Director.
- School Site/District Professional Development Days/Workshops: College Fellows may be invited by school or district partners to attend professional development opportunities. The Project Director must approve all the trainings College Fellows plans to attend.

4. What attire is required for College Fellows?

Professional attire is required during business hours.

5. How much graduate school and career exploration/support is offered to College Fellows?

While the focus of the UC Merced CAC Scholars Program is to provide hands-on college access field experience, training, and support to high school students, College Fellows are also offered opportunities for graduate school and career exploration. Specifically, College Fellows are allowed a maximum of 8 hours a month for graduate school research/planning and application completion (requires prior approval from the Project Director). Additionally, the UC Merced CAC Scholars Program will provide minimum of two workshops or panels per semester on graduate school and/or career topics.

6. What type of guidance and support will College Fellows receive?

College Fellows will be under the direction of a Project Director. In some regions, the Project Director will work in collaboration with other CEP Project Directors to provide coaching and direction to College Fellows. College Fellows are expected to uphold professional expectations, such as completion of projects and specific services, punctuality, and professionalism. The Project Director will not be at the school sites daily but will require check-ins and updates upon request. The Project Director will conduct routine school site visits and observations of school site activities. While the Project Director perform a variety duties, he/she is expected to manage, coach, and provide professional development to all College Fellows and monitor the implementation of minimum standards and requirements.

7. Do College Fellows receive health benefits?

The UC Merced CAC Scholars Program does not offer College Fellows health benefits.

8. When do College Fellows receive their living allowance stipends and are taxes deducted from the stipends?

College Fellows will receive a \$2,610 monthly living allowance for a total of 10 months. Upon the successful completion of two 10-month terms of service, College Fellows will be eligible to receive a \$4,000 Year-End Award in June of 2020. Each monthly living allowance is disbursed sometime during the last two weeks of every month. Taxes are not deducted from the monthly living allowance or the Year-End Award. Since this is a taxable fellowship, College Fellows are advised to consult with a tax expert to report their allowances and Year-End Award.
