Colonial Acres Phase V Board of Directors Meeting

The meeting was called to order by Claude Danielson at 1:06 p.m.

Present were Bill Charles, Jerri Valentine, Pauline Williamson, Judy Keeling, Paul Trala and Jim Reuschlien

Minutes from last meeting were read and approved. Treasurer's report was read and approved.

Jim Reuschlien Report:

1) regarding the additional wall drop box for the clubhouse for coop monthly payments—the cost of the drop box is \$200. Cost to install is also \$200. Purchase was approved.

2) Emergency lighting for clubhouse—LED emergency exit lights with floodlights and battery back ups for \$60, recommended by Paul Trala. John McGraw would handle installation. A motion was made by Bill Charles to purchase 3 fixtures for the exits. Pauline Williamson seconded the motion.

3) Mulch will be installed behind building 71 to form a walking path, replacing the rocks currently there. Pauline made a motion to move forward with the project. Jerri Valentine seconded it. Paul Trala offered to haul the mulch in for the job.

4) A slight adjustment has been made to the rules—known as exhibit 1 D, limiting satellite dish height to 12 ft. from grade as the maximum height. Bill Charles moved to accept the change. Pauline Williamson seconded it.

Jim says currently there are 5 units on the market from \$80-93,000.

34 units were cited for repairs to the sunrooms and owner notices have been sent out.

The small wood list is actively being worked on (those units that only needed minor repairs).

The large wood repairs will soon start on buildings 60 and 65.

Roof repairs will start the 3rd week of June.

Concrete is still out for bids and will be started at the end of the summer.

The board is closing next week on the management owned unit.

Claude Danielson asked if we could explore the possibility of grinding concrete slabs that had lifted instead of always replacing them. He also inquired about concrete jacking as another more cost effective approach. Jim Reuschlien said he would look into both.

Bob Ciszewski suggested we consider paver stones for step replacement.

Jerri Valentine said she is happy that our delinquent account list has begun to diminish.

Bill Charles commented on how good our pool now looks with repairs done and water in and circulated. This brought a round of applause for Larry and Sue Latham. Larry Latham said if the water test which was taken to the County passes, they will open the pool on Saturday. The pool pump had to be replaced along with a part in the pool heater. Chemicals are balancing and the water temperature is up to 82 degrees.

There was also a round of applause for the flower beds at the clubhouse entrance. Sue Latham, master gardener said she was still looking for volunteers to help once a month to water.

Because of two recent incidents with driving on common ground that has broken sprinkler lines and control boxes, Claude has issued a reminder which is in our bylaws—NO DRIVING ON COMMON GROUND. Violators will be fined and all costs for repair and attorney fees will be billed to the guilty parties.

Bob Ciszewski thinks the drainage behind his unit is inadequate and has requested regrading or at the least, some expert attention to the problem. Claude Danielson assured him they would reevaluate the issue.

Jack Saunders said he was not happy with the new restrictions for members only at the card games, especially Texas Holdem. Claude indicated they would ask their attorney to review the gaming laws and come back to us with the legal opinion.

Jackie Betke Bldg. 65-1 says she has rotten wood which needs to be replaced on her building. She also mentioned our new parking lot lights appear to be coming on before dark. They are on sensors.

Shirley Vaughn 71-3 says her wooden wall has pulled away from the building. The heaved cement has caused the bus stop to lean forward and her brick retaining wall is broken. Paul Trala said he had checked it and the bus stop was an issue. Meeting adjourned at 2:05 p.m.

National Cherry Festival features Blue Angels By Bill Semion

If you like air shows and things made with Michigan cherries, the National Cherry Festival coming up in early July is your excuse to get outta town for a few days. Or if August is more to your liking, we've got some airborne action for you closer to Phase V.

The National Cherry Festival in Traverse City is lucky to have a return engagement of the Navy's Blue Angels about every other year, and this is the year. They'll be performing both over the city and over Grand Traverse Bay July 2-4.

The performance of the Blues, however, is just one part of Festival air show events, and events overall celebrating the region's tart cherry bounty as well as other draws it offers travelers. It's the perfect topping to a mid-summer visit to northern Michigan.

The show is scheduled to begin each day around 1 p.m., and there are both free and ticketed places to watch, including the new Hotel Indigo. One of the best ways is to grab a blanket and head to the waterfront early.

In addition to the Blue Angels, several other precision flight groups are performing for

the festival, including the Redline stunt team, the Royal Canadian Air Force demo team, and two local performance aircraft fliers. It all starts with a Coast Guard Air station open house on July 1 where you can meet many of the air show performers. That's not only what's going on here, July 2-9, of course.

Cherry treats every day, concerts by groups you may know, like the 70s band Cheap Trick, performing July 8, to excursions to area wineries, orchard tours, and three parades including the Cherry Royale on Saturday, July 9. Find the complete schedule and times at cherryfestival.org.

For air show fun much closer, head to Willow Run and the Thunder Over Michigan show Aug. 20 and 21, to benefit in part the Yankee Air Museum. It'll feature an air show by the Breitling demo team, aircraft rides, and an appearance by the Batcopter of Batman TV and movie fame, a mock World War II battle, and more. Strolling for Mustard

On a lovely spring day in May, Colonial Acres Phase V board secretary Judy Keeling and I walked along wooded areas in search of garlic mustard. As we strolled, we talked about places lived and places traveled.

Judy quickly learned how to spot garlic mustard, an invasive plant that dots the creek behind the clubhouse and along the berm parallel to the railroad track.

We each pulled the tall, green plants topped with four tiny white petals, and placed them in trash bags. No tools needed, just a pair of gloves, sunhat plastic trash bags and a little motivation. In about an hour and a half we filled eight bags with garlic mustard.

Along the way we discovered a blooming purple lilac bush, trillium and a few other wildflowers. Judy pressed me to continue walking, always to see what was beyond the next group of trees. It was a morning well spent, and I appreciated her interest in learning about this invasive plant, which has the potential to choke out our native trillium and May apple flowers.

Next year I hope to be in South Lyon in May and will be looking for a few volunteers to protect our wooded areas by looking for garlic mustard and pulling it out. It comes out of the dirt easily, no digging needed, just the ability to bend over and pull it out. If I could get just one person to monitor the area along the creek by the clubhouse, and another to take care of the berm parallel to the railroad track along Arlington would be a tremendous help. I will train you in the spring (it takes about two minutes to learn how to identify the plant.) Please consider this important stewardship activity to protect our wooded areas!

In a previous column I mentioned 2016 is the 100th anniversary of the signing of the Migratory Bird Treaty Act, which provides federal protection to bird species. The Michigan Department of Natural Resources (MDNR) will hold a "Feathered Friends Weekend" at selected state parks with State Explorer Programs on June 24. State Explorer Programs provide summer interpreters at 40 State Parks and Recreation Areas, including Belle Isle, Brighton, Island Lake, Maybury, Pinckney and Proud Lake. In conjunction with the DNR Wildlife Division, Explorer Guides will offer various bird-themed programs during this special weekend. 
