(Continued from Page 1) Armed Forces Thailand Network (AFTN) provides radio service at 21 bases, camps and sites for the listening pleasure

of American servicemen in Thailand. Operating 24 hours a day, the network broadcasts a wide variety including news, weather, sports, educational and musical entertainment, and religious programs. Television service was completed in April 1969 to provide intertainment for personnel at Udorn, Ubon, Takhli, Korat, Nakhon Phanom RTAFBs and U-Tapao Airfield, The radio network operates on an AM band.

Headquarters for AFTN is at Korat RTAFB where hourly news programs are prepared from wire services and the Armed Forces News Bureau. Affiliate stations also produce local news and feature programs.
