Dear St Pius And St Anthony Churches,

4th Sunday Advent Year C Luke 1:39-45

The Visitation: Mary visits Elizabeth to share the joyful news of her and Elizabeth's mutually surprising pregnancies! Yet, what a wonderful theme for Advent: Visitations! There are so many visits and travels contained in Advent-Christmas! Gabriel visits Mary, an angel visits Zechariah, Mary visits Zechariah (with Jesus visiting John inside their moms-'Would that be a 'womb' call, not a 'zoom' call!). And more to come, with the shepherds and wise men visiting Mary & Joseph in Bethlehem and then the shepherds go on visiting all over the mountain, 'telling' everyone in the hills and villages of Christ's birth (the Shepherds are the 1st evangelists!) Then, Joseph and Mary visit the Temple (Presentation) with the newborn Jesus! And that brings us to the most important visit of all: God visits us in Jesus Christ! God comes to dwell among us here on earth. We call that the Incarnation: God become human, God entering our humanity, visiting and staying among us. We call Jesus "Immanuel" which means 'God with us' (Matt 1:23 quoting Isaiah 7:14). So, this season celebrates 'visitations'!

Christmas reminds us of all the good pastimes and traditions of visiting that may have fallen away. We need to revive the practice of 'visiting' again. There is a wonderful sense of 'family' inherent in visiting others and checking on one another. I am reminded of people saying to me 'When you drop by, come around to the back door, that is where family comes in!' Or another sign I saw that hanging on a door that read 'Back door neighbors are the best neighbors". Both of those sayings reflect the homey and comfortable closeness that builds over time with welcome visitations. We need such 'community closeness and feeling' more than ever now in our fractured societies. I remember (Did you ever do this?) as a child being sent to our neighbors' homes to ask them about borrowing a cup of sugar or a pickle or egg for mom to finish making a bowl of tuna salad for dinner. Or maybe o over and knock on our neighbor, Mr Allen's door, to see if he is okay, because no one saw him out sitting in his yard that morning as he always did. Or maybe you remember 'Sunday drivers' or Sunday 'Go to the country' visits of grandparents, to spend the afternoon. Communities could benefit from rediscovering a better sense of dropping by to say 'hi' and just ask 'watcha doing?' of each other. Or take and drop off a couple of recently baked cookies to a neighbor.

Well, Christmas brings its own wonderful opportunities to take up visiting again! Imagine with me all of the 'Visit' traditions that have grown up around Christmas. It starts with the idea of St Nicholas visiting homes of children and the poor to deliver them some blessing (even if only a little coin or food). At this time of year, People bake so much candy, cakes and other unique seasonal treats to share with others. I've have noticed a trend in the past couple years of more -'in person' delivery trips (maybe due more to the many shipping delays from the big delivery companies. I recall a friend last year who sent a family member a box of fudge that arrived two months later (it made for some 'hardtack' candy!) Maybe the reason people make so much candy at this time of year, is because it gives us a reason to go see other people- (Or the companies printing the food recipes on their labels make recipe amounts huge to sell more ingredients!) but the visiting and sharing is a great practice of this 'giving' season-give some food and some time to others -some personal time along with our favorite recipe. But we have other holiday traditions that naturally bring us out to visit other people. I think about how we decorate our homes with evergreens, ribbons and lights gives a reason to check out each other's 'Christmas Home' touches! But also, think of the many Carolers strolling around sidewalks/streets filling the air with songs of joy and celebration. In the old days, carolers even showed up at houses unannounced to surprise neighbors with mini-music concerts (candles & music)! So maybe we can all rediscover the joy of visiting others this Christmas season. We would be in good company following the practices of Gabriel, Mary, Elizabeth, the shepherds, wise men, Joseph and especially Jesus! What Jesus did for us by coming to dwell among us, we can imitate by hospitably going out to others and bring them some 'presence' by visiting and giving them some of our time, joy and refreshment!


