By-laws

of the
Rosebud Arrow, Rod, and Gun Club
Winner, South Dakota

ARTICLE 1 — Name

The name of this organization shall be Rosebud Arrow, Rod, & Gun Club referred to as RARGC.

ARTICLE 2 — Objective

The objective of this organization shall be the encouragement of organized rifle, pistol, and archery shooting among citizens of the United States resident in our community, with a view toward a better knowledge on the part of such citizens of the safe handling and proper care of firearms, as well as improved marksmanship. It shall be our further objective and purpose to forward the development of those characteristics of honesty, good fellowship, self-discipline, team play and self-reliance which are the essentials of good sportsmanship and the foundation of true patriotism.

ARTICLE 3 — Membership

Any citizen of the United States 18 years of age or older may become a member of this organization on vote of the Executive Committee after subscribing to the following pledge and on payment of the usual initiation fee and dues.

The NRA Pledge

I CERTIFY that I am a citizen of good repute of the United States of America; that I am not a member of any organization or group having as its purpose or one of its purposes the overthrow by force and violence of the Government of the United States or any of its political subdivisions; that I have never been convicted of a crime of violence; and that, if admitted to membership, I will fulfill the obligations of good sportsmanship and good citizenship.

ARTICLE 4 — Dues

(a) The member's annual dues to the club shall be \$50.00 for Basic membership, also known as Level 1. \$100.00 for Full membership, also known as Level 2. Spouses/significant others are \$25.00 with paid Basic or Full membership. Dues are payable not later than January 31st of each year. See schedule A for prorating of dues paid after the January 31st deadline.

(b) No member of the club in arrears shall be eligible to vote or to enjoy any other of the privileges or benefits offered by this club

ARTICLE 5 — Meetings

(a) Annual Meeting. The annual meeting of the club shall be held on the 1st Monday of February in each year. If the annual meeting shall not take place at the time fixed it shall be held within a reasonable time thereafter, and the officers shall hold over until their successors shall have been elected.

(b) Regular Meetings. The regular business meetings of the club for the transaction of ordinary business shall be held on the 1st Monday of each month, at such time and place as fixed the Executive Committee.

(c) Special Meetings. A special meeting of the club may be held at any time upon the call of the President or upon the

call of the Executive Committee, or upon demand in writing, stating the object of the proposed meeting, and signed by not less than 20% of the members entitled to vote. Notice of the time, place and object of any special meeting shall be given all officers and members in good standing in writing by United States mail or email not less than seven days prior to the date fixed for the holding of the meeting. The place of such special meeting shall be fixed by the Executive Committee.

(d) Quorum. The attendance of five (5) members in good standing with the club is necessary to constitute a quorum for the transaction of any business

ARTICLE 6 — Officers

(a) The officers of this club shall be a President, Vice President, Secretary, Treasurer, Chief Instructors, and Executive Officer who, acting together, shall constitute the Executive Committee. They shall be elected by a majority vote by ballot of the members in good standing present at the annual meeting of the club. They shall hold office for one year or until their successors are elected.

(b) The Executive Committee shall have general supervision and control of all the activities of the club.

(c) Meetings of the Executive Committee shall be held regularly at such time and place as the Committee may determine. Special meetings may be held at any time on the call of the President or on demand, in writing to the Secretary, by three members of the Committee.

(d) Three (3) members of the Committee shall constitute a quorum.

(e) Resignation of any officer may be accepted by a majority vote of the remaining members of the Executive Committee.

(f) A vacancy in the Executive Committee may be filled by a majority vote of the remaining members of the Committee. However, if more than one vacancy exists a special meeting of the club shall be called and new officers shall be elected to fill the vacancies until the date of the next annual meeting as provided in paragraph (a) above.

(g) The officers of this club may maintain individual membership in the National Rifle Association for their tenure of office.

ARTICLE 7 — Duties of Officers

(a) President. The President shall preside at all meetings of the club and of the Executive Committee. He shall be a member ex-officio of all regular and special committees and shall perform all such other duties as usually pertain to his office. President signs checks in absence of Treasurer.

(b) Vice-President. The Vice-President shall perform the duties of the President in his absence or at his request.

(c) Secretary. The Secretary shall conduct all official correspondence pertaining to the proper preparation and forwarding of all reports required of the club by the National Rifle Association and by the Civilian Marksmanship Program. He shall notify the members of the Executive Committee of all meetings and shall notify all member of special and annual meetings, as required in Article V. He shall keep a true record of all meetings of the Executive Committee and of the club and have the custody of the books and papers of the club, except the Treasurer's books of account. All applications for membership in the club shall be made to the Secretary. He shall be responsible for the collection of all fees and dues and shall remit the same to the Treasurer, taking his proper receipt therefor.

(d) Treasurer. The Treasurer shall have charge of all funds of the club and place the same in such bank or banks as may be approved by the Executive Committee. Such money shall only be withdrawn by check signed by the Treasurer and for the payment of such bills as shall have been approved by the Executive Committee. The Treasurer shall keep an accurate account of all his transactions and render a detailed report with vouchers at any meeting of the Executive Committee when requested and an annual report to the organization at its annual meeting. He shall be responsible for reaffiliating the club annually with the NRA

(e) Chief Instructors. The instructor shall have charge of each discipline instruction with authority to appoint his assistants. He shall contract no bills without the authorization of the Executive Committee.

(f) Executive Officer. The Executive Officer shall have charge of the ranges of the club, the printing of scorecards, the arranging of competitions, etc. He shall contract no bills without the authorization of the Executive Committee.

ARTICLE 8 — Suspension or Expulsion

(a) Any officer may be removed by a two-thirds vote of the members in good standing present at any special meeting called for this purpose. No vote on suspension or removal may be taken unless at least fifteen days' notice in writing shall have been given to the officer of the reasons for his removal and of the time and place of the special meeting at which such ballot on his removal is to be taken. At such special meeting the officer shall be given a full hearing.

(b) Any member may be suspended or expelled from the club for any cause deemed sufficient by the Executive Committee by two-thirds vote of the members of the Committee present at any regular or special meeting. No vote on suspension or expulsion may be taken unless at least fifteen days' notice in writing shall have been given to the members of the charges preferred and of the time and place of the meeting of the Executive Committee at which such charges will be considered. At such meeting the member under charges will be accorded a full hearing.

(c) Charges against any officer or member may be preferred by any member in good standing. They shall be in writing clearly stating the facts relied upon and accompanied by all affidavits or exhibits which are to be used in their

support. Such charges shall be filed with the Secretary, who will immediately notify the President. The President will call a meeting of the Executive Committee to hear the charges. The Secretary will give at least fifteen days' notice of the meeting to each member of the Executive Committee and to the accuser and to the accused, which notice shall be in writing and will include a true copy of the charges and of the supporting affidavits and exhibits.

(d) Any member suspended or expelled by the Executive Committee may appeal to the full membership of the club. Such appeal shall be made in writing to the Secretary who will notify the President. The President will call a special meeting of the club for the purpose of acting on the appeal. The Secretary shall give at least fifteen days' notice in writing to all members of the club in good standing stating the date, time, place, and reason for such special meeting. At the meeting of the full club the Secretary will read the original charges, the supporting affidavits, and will read or display the accompanying exhibits, and will read the minutes of the special meeting of the Executive Committee at which the charges were heard and action taken. A full hearing will be given the accuser and the accused. A vote will be taken by ballot of the members in good standing present and a two-thirds vote shall be required to reverse the action of the Executive Committee.

(e) Any official or member of the club who has been suspended or expelled by the National Rifle Association of America shall automatically stand suspended or expelled from this club immediately upon receipt of official notice by the Secretary of this club from the Secretary of the National Association.

(f) The National Rifle Association shall be given a complete report whenever a member of the club is suspended or expelled, showing charges and action taken.



ARTICLE 9 — Match Rules


All competitions held by the club will be governed by the rules and regulations laid down by the governing body of that discipline.

ARTICLE 10 — Amendments

Any proposed amendments to these by-laws may be introduced by any member of the club at any regular meeting or special meeting called for the purpose. They must be acted upon by the club membership at a regular meeting or special meeting called for the purpose provided a copy of the approved amendments has been sent to each club member by the United States mail or email at least ten days previous to the meeting. A two-thirds vote of the members present will be necessary to pass or reject it.

Schedule A

Membership Dues

Basic or Level 1 Membership: \$50.00, gives member opportunities which include using the ranges at a discounted cost of \$4.00 (this does not include the \$3.00 per round fee for trap and paper targets for guns and archery), voting rights in the club, NRA Insurance, and a monthly newsletter. Basic members may be left alone in club house as long as Full member as let them in the door.

Full or Level 2 Membership: \$100.00, gives the member full use of the ranges at no extra cost (except the trap range where there is a \$3.00 a round fee and paper target costs for archery and gun), voting rights in the club. NRA Insurance, and a monthly newsletter, and the combination to the door of the RARGC's facility.

Spouse/Significant Other: \$25.00, gives a Basic or Full member's spouse or significant other the opportunity to have all the same opportunities as their spouse/significant other has.

Prorated Memberships: Memberships that are paid after the January 31st deadline. Community members wishing to become members of the RARGC after the deadline will pay the full price of membership, with no prorating if membership is applied for before September 1st. After September 1st, the applicant will pay \$10.00 for every month of the year that is left PLUS the next years FULL (Level 2) membership dues of \$100.00.

Limited/Special Memberships: These memberships will be issued when events are being held at the range where non-members will be participating. Membership cards and roster will be filled out by Executive Officer or appointed person. Events that require limited/special memberships will be voted on by RARGC club members prior to the event. Limited/Special memberships will be \$5.00 per day.

Schedule B

Range/Target Fees

The age of any shooter in the approved disciplines shall be at the discretion of the Range Officer running the line.

Indoor Archery/Gun Range: Full (Level 2) members can shoot on this range without extra cost to member. Basic (Level 1) members can shoot on this range with a discounted cost of \$4.00 per day. This doesn't include paper targets (see below for target prices). Non-Members pay \$5.00 per day to use these ranges. Children under 18 years of age shoot free (not including paper targets) when accompanied by a responsible adult.

Outdoor Pistol Range: Any member Full or Basic may shoot on this range without any extra cost to member. The member needs to bring their own targets, none are provided for this range. Non-Members must buy a special limited membership to use this range. It is a cost of \$5.00 per day to use this range. Limited memberships will only be allowed if the Executive Committee has a majority vote. These memberships were put into place for events that are scheduled at the club, any individual wishing to using the range on their own, needs to buy a RARGC basic or full membership.

Outdoor Archery Range: Any member Full or Basic may shoot on this range without any extra cost to member. The member needs to bring their own targets or buy from the club paper targets (see below for target prices). Non-members pay \$5.00 per day to use this range. Children under the age of 18 shoot free (not including paper targets) when accompanied by a responsible adult.

Trap Range: Any member Full or Basic may shoot on this range without a range fee. There is a \$4.00 per round fee that ALL members are obligated to pay. This fee is to cover costs of clay targets. Non-members will pay \$5.00 per round. Children under 18 years of age but older than 8 years of age may shoot, round fees of \$3.00 will apply, when accompanied by a responsible adult.

Paper Target Prices: Only use targets out of the target holders marked RARGC

Archery Targets NEW \$.50 per target

The use of used archery targets is free to the members

Gun Targets \$.25 per target
