The concert will take place at the Avery Fisher Hall. It is part of the Lincoln Centre for the Performing Arts complex. It is home to the New York Philharmonic and has a capacity of 2,738 seats, most of which we hope to see filled. It was designed by Max Abnromovitz and opened in 1962.

Many other famous performers besides Leonard Bernstein have graced this stage, including Simon & Garfunkel, who recorded their live album (*Live from New York City*) there in 1967. Queen also performed their *Sheer Heart Attack* tour there in 1975

The Show

The evening is actually two shows in one. The first half was inspired by what Jason Mlynek saw and heard on YouTube. It features over 200 choristers from around the world. Music celebrating women, revering them, saluting them and honouring them will be sung. The music begins with Guy Forbes' *Ave Maria* and Eleanor Daley's *I Sing of a Maiden*. We will have your toes tapping to Cancion de Los Tszchilas by Michael Sample and we finish off with *Joy*, music by John Muehleisen who set the poetry of Sara Teasdale to music. Hilary Apfelstadt conducts.

The second half is very different. Vance George will be conducting Carl Orff's *Carmina Burana*. The text of this piece covers a wide range of topics which are as familiar to audiences when they were written (11th to 13th centuries) as they are to our own time. The fickleness of fortune and fame and the fleeting nature of life are among the topics. Apparently the reigning regime at the time was concerned about the erotic tone of some of the pieces, but this work became the most famous piece of music composed in Germany when it was completed in 1934.
