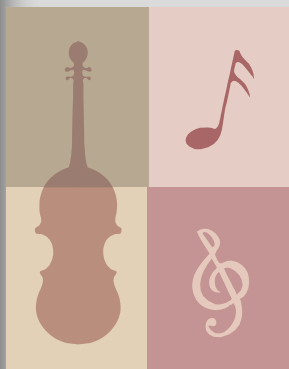

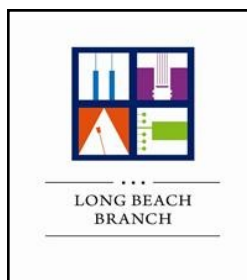
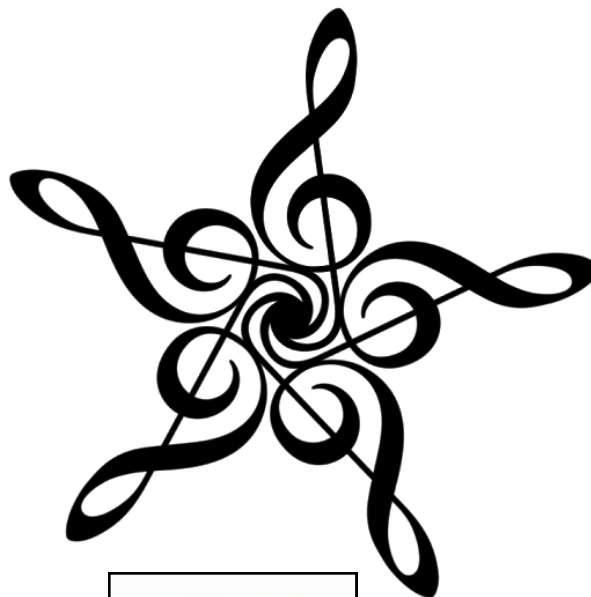

General Meeting Report: Marc Lombardino

Our second general meeting was held on Sunday, October 5th at 3:30 PM. Elisabeth Pehlivanian, a former MTAC branch President, and reputable voice and piano teacher, taught a vocal masterclass. The studios represented were those of Harriet Bennish, Maureen Lombardino, Adriana Manfredi, and Sarah Sandvig. All of the students performed admirably, and Elisabeth was very pleased to work with them.

The overall theme of this masterclass was what to expect from a college audition; Elisabeth went into detail about what an auditioner wants to see and hear from a student who wants to enter an undergraduate program in vocal performance. Everything from posture to vocal production is important, but her key focus was that auditioners really want to see a student perform well, and the audition environment is not always the best for that. Thus, a student has to learn to be flexible; as scary as an audition might be, the people behind the table have to seem like your students' grandparents.

When a program accepts a new undergraduate, they are making an investment. Despite increasing tuition and fees in the US, it still costs a university much more to educate that one student than the fees cover, especially at a public school. Thus, an auditioner isn't just looking for a high level of skill and talent, but also potential. Everyone has areas on which they can improve, and trying to hide them during an audition can hinder musicality; it's always better to put your best foot forward.
