Delegate Report: *Marla Devich*

Attending an MTAC Convention is a little like going to a smorgasbord...there's a lot to sample and not enough time to try everything that you would like. As I'm sure everyone does, I carefully looked through the schedule and marked the events that piqued my interest. In the end I probably attended about half of those sessions, allowing myself the freedom to experience some unexpected delights.

The Young Artist Guild Recital is always the highlight of the first day of convention. This year's group of budding young artists did not disappoint, seven amazing pianists playing a fabulous program which included works from Bach to Liszt, Beethoven to Barber and Prokofiev. Because I wanted to attend an early-morning session the next day, I had originally thought that I might leave at the intermission. I am so grateful that I decided to stay and enjoy the remaining artists, as this allowed me to hear the electric Athena Tsianos. On Saturday, December 13 our branch will feature Athena in a recital at our Seal Beach church. This will be your opportunity to experience what I did on that magical night in June.

One of the best sessions that I attended was Janet Stoller's informative lecture about the Cognitive Benefits of Music Instruction. She first addressed some of the misconceptions about the benefits of music instruction and cited various studies that have led researchers to conclude that music instruction does change the brain, in that it helps to increase the link between the two sides of the brain. Playing a musical instrument, however, does not help students score higher on tests. Ms. Stoller stressed the importance of an organized lesson routine, which would include 2 to 3 minutes of skills & drills. Additionally, she said that teaching concepts to students can help them in making musical decisions.

Some of my other favorite sessions were the Scriabin recital, played ethereally by Dmitry Rachmanov; Nancy Bachus' Masterclass for intermediate pianists and her lecture on intermediate piano literature; Boogie on the Barbie, which allowed us to sample 20th music; and of course, the amazing Anderson and Roe concert....what a treat!

By far, however, the absolute best thing about attending convention is the opportunity to share the experience with my friends and colleagues, who all care so deeply about the integrity of what they bring to the community and their students.





