WORSHIP AND PRAYER

Everyday Stewardship:

Today's Gospel features a persistent widow who ekes out justice from a notoriously cold-hearted judge. Why does she win the day? "Because the widow keeps bothering me." Jesus' recommendation to the disciples is to be persistent in prayer. If only it were that easy, right?

There are, of course, many legitimate cries for justice. We live in a fallen world filled with flawed human beings. Faced with the problem of evil, we may wonder how God will "secure the rights of his chosen ones." Sometimes, He may well seem "slow to answer them."

In the face of these very real questions, it's important to recall the words of the prophet Isaiah, that God's thoughts "are not [our] thoughts." His ways are not our ways. God respects the freedom He has given us. . We are invited to be persistent in our prayer, to continue bringing our concerns before God in trusting surrender. We are invited to love well in the circumstances we find ourselves in, to be a light in the darkness. No matter when — or if — our prayers are answered the way we would like, we are nonetheless invited to witness to "faith on earth."



This week we will look at what some of the saints say regarding the role of music in the Church and in our lives. Probably the most famous quote from any saint regarding music is from St. Augustine. "He who sings well prays twice." What does St. Augustine mean by this? Of course, God does not count our prayers and give us credit based on the number of our prayers. I think what St. Augustine is getting at is that music has a special way of opening the human heart to God's grace. God is always pouring out His grace and gifts upon us, but we can often be like bottles with the caps sealed tight. Sung prayer helps us to forget ourselves and open ours hearts to God grace and the power of the Holy Spirit. So, the one who sings reaps greater benefits of prayer because of his or her greater openness to God. St Paul clearly understood this as he urged the early Christians in the letter to the Ephesians, "...Be filled with the Spirit, addressing one another in psalms and hymns and spiritual songs, singing and making melody to the Lord with all your heart." Let's all examine our personal prayer lives. Is there a way that music can deepen our prayer and our relationship with God?
