Remembering God's Faithful Abundance------ with Pastor Eric

For every wild animal of the forest is mine, the cattle on a thousand hills. Psalm 50:10

When I was working for a hurricane inter-faith recovery group, I remember our faithful director referring to this simple verse in psalm 50. She would begin every budget meeting with this verse written on the whiteboard. We had 60-70 homes destroyed and rice crops devastated by Hurricane Claudette along the Gulf Coast of Texas. Right after the storm hit, we received emergency aid from all over the country – FEMA came in right away along with Lutheran Disaster Relief and various church groups from everywhere. However, once the next storm hit on the east coast and a few weeks went by, these agencies and aide dried up and was channeled to other disaster sites. It was up to us local people on the recovery board to find the money, secure the labor and help meet the long-term needs of hundreds of families. I felt overwhelmed and abandoned with so much left to do to bring recovery to the area.

The Director for recovery reminded us that God had resources galore like cattle on a thousand hills just waiting to be given to help all of us in this season of apparent scarcity. She was right! God provided all that was needed to bring healing to the victims of Hurricane Claudette – and we had thirty thousand dollars left over to share with other disaster agencies like ours!

At Christmas time, we remember that Jesus came into the world in extreme poverty, born in a stable, to an unwed mother and surrounded by smelly shepherds with the king out to get him. From the time that the angel Gabriel announced to Mary that God found favor with her to their flight into Egypt as refugees, the holy family had to believe that God had everything in hand.

You might feel abandoned, overwhelmed, and distressed right now. The economy is shaky, and prices are high, gifts are subject to the supply chain situation and travel raises another headache around covid and staffing shortages. Now is the time to remember the simple mantra of psalm 50, God has cattle on a thousand hills. Take a breath, say a prayer, and look around at ways in which God is providing what is needed right now.

Maybe you can think about it this way. We tend to look at the Mississippi River as an awesome source of water for travel, drinking and irrigation which in turn flows into the mighty Gulf of Mexico, which in turn connects to the Atlantic Ocean. We should remember that the Mississippi is fed with water from thousands of little streams and rivers that quietly flow and give their waters into the mighty river. There are streams of giving that feed our lives every day – not just money but other ways that feed our needs for life and growth. God has streams that make glad the city of God and water the trees that bear fruit for life everlasting from every direction.

Psalm 65: 9-10



#### **Never Alone**

Two years ago, Kayla knew it was time for a change in her life. She had struggled with substance use for years. When she was pregnant with her youngest son, Rafe, she was determined to build a brighter future for him. She entered treatment to become sober and create a healthy home for her baby.

While in treatment, Kayla enrolled in the HOPES program through LSI Early Childhood Services, which provides in-home parenting education and guidance for parents of young children. Kellie, Kayla's LSI worker, met with her every week to ensure she had all the resources and support she needed to raise Rafe in her home. They kept track of all his important developmental milestones, sharing smiles and laughs along the way. Whether it was supplying diapers or being a listening ear, Kellie was always there for Kayla.

Kayla is now two years sober, has a job as a chef, and feels empowered and confident that she has everything she needs to help her family thrive.

"I just feel overwhelmed and overjoyed. I never thought I could do all this, so I'm proud of myself," she says. "There are people at LSI that care about you. They are there to support you and they are willing to help."
