

DAVE CHISHOLM

It is with great sadness that I have to report the death of Dave Chisholm at the age of 74 on 18th September, after a short illness. Self-effacing by nature, and notoriously camera-shy, Dave ("Chis" to his mates) was nevertheless one of the stalwarts of the Harriers. He was one of the small band who revived the fortunes of the club in the 1970s, after it had been in a state of suspended animation for many years, and he was club secretary throughout the 1980s. He also produced the first few newsletters. Without the advantages of today's technology, they were hand-typed and duplicated and posted through the internal mail, but they did the job of keeping the membership informed. Dave was also a fully qualified timekeeper and race official, and used these skills at numerous race meetings. Last and by no means least, it was Chis who designed and made the club's most coveted trophy, the Whinger's Trophy. An astute judge of expertise in others, he chose to make the first award to Clive Bellamy. 20 years of musical chairs later, Clive found himself in the hot seat again, and repaid the compliment by awarding the trophy to Chis....and the following year, proving his judgement to be as sound as ever, Chis awarded it to Jon Leek!

CHAMPIONSHIP POINTS FOR ULTRA AND FELL RACE EVENTS

The proposal was outlined in the last newsletter, but since then it has undergone further refinement. Without going into too much detail, it was felt that the wide disparity in the arduousness of events and in the quality of the winning times made the scoring too variable. It's impossible to eliminate that problem, but to mitigate it, we've decided to subdivide both categories into "short", "medium" and "long", according to well established rules, and award a maximum of 25 points in each sub-category. The scoring chart is shown on the back page of this newsletter.

Following a comparison between last season's actual championship and a "shadow" one, calculated according to the new rules, the committee has agreed to implement the proposal this season on a three-year trial basis. During the three years, we may tweak the scoring if necessary, and at the end of it we'll decide whether to continue. The aim is twofold; to recognise the achievements of the modest number of Harriers who regularly take part in these events, and to encourage others to have a go.

One aspect worth mentioning here is that, as an exception to the rule about fell races having to be listed in the FRA events calendar, we've decided to include the Dovedale Dash, a local event with a long history of RRH participation. The Dash was devised in the 1950s by Ken Broadhurst, later to be one of the team who kick-started the revival of the Harriers in the 1970s, and for many years club chairman. It takes place on the first Sunday of each November at 11am.

A final point – don't expect me to pick up your times automatically. I'll do what I can, but that will be quite limited. It will be up to you to keep me informed.

MASTERS AGE CATEGORIES

The Derbyshire Athletics Association has decided to fall in line with WAVA (World Association of Veteran Athletes) and BMAF (British Masters Athletics Federation) for the men's masters category to start at the age of 35 instead of 40. We in the Harriers have decided to retain our existing categories for the club championship and domestic races however, to avoid having to redefine our trophies and championship scoring.

SOUTH WEST COAST PATH, PART 3

This year's summer epic saw a Harriers team complete the SW Coast Path, started in 2009 with the coast of Cornwall, and continued in 2016 with Somerset and North Devon. That left South Devon and Dorset, a distance of 197 miles. Logistics, mainly available time, dictated leaving some gaps, so the less interesting bits of the path around Plymouth, the Exe estuary and Weymouth had to be omitted. But what remained was glorious, especially (in my humble opinion) the final section in eastern Dorset, around Lulworth Cove. In the event 153 miles were covered in four days in May, in largely fine weather (it rained one afternoon between Torquay and Starcross), and another box was ticked!
