We will do everything that the LORD has told us.
(Exodus 24:3)

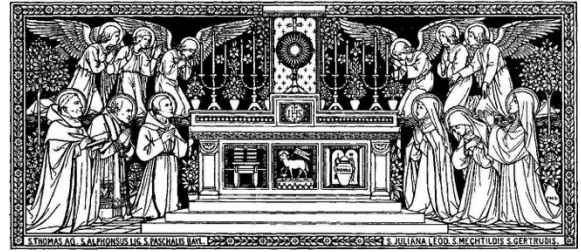
On Mount Sinai, Moses presided over the swearing of a sacred covenant between God and the people of Israel. After explaining the provisions of this covenant, Moses sprinkled the people with the blood of sacrificed animals, and the people responded by promising to “heed and do” everything God had commanded (Exodus 24:7). They have their marching orders, and they intent to follow them.

The Israelites’ response to Moses is clearly admirable and pleasing to the Lord, but today’s feast of the Body and Blood of Christ invites us to consider to him. We are so used to focusing on “doing,” but at its heart, the mystery of the Eucharist is focused on “being” more than “doing.” Just as the bread and wine *become* the Body and Blood of the Lord at Mass, so do we *become* the body of Christ when we gather for worship and receive him in Communion. So when we say “Amen” just before receiving the Eucharist, we can say in our hearts, “We will be everything the Lord has made us to be.”

This is one of the greatest miracles of our faith. As the Fathers of the Second Vatican Council taught, “Really partaking of the body of the Lord in the breaking of the Eucharistic bread, we are taken up into communion with him and with one another” (Lumen Gentium, 7). Communion-with Christ! And that communion, received in faith and founded on grace, changes us. It fills us with divine love and divine grace. It transforms us so that we become more like Jesus.

Of course, it’s a good thing to *do* what God is asking us to do. But today is a perfect day to celebrate who you *are becoming*. Treasured and redeemed and beloved, you are taking on the likeness of the very One you are receiving!

“Jesus, thank you for giving me a share in your Body and Blood, your Soul and Divinity!”



Living a Eucharistic Life

“Even outside the Eucharist, God communicates with us, descending with His grace into our souls. We feel that He is present, we experience His supernatural influence and inspiration, His appeals to us to do good.

But in the Eucharist, we have far more than this. We have the God-Man as the food of our souls, through which we live His own life, so that, like St Paul, it is no longer we who live but Christ Who lives in us.

This intimate and mysterious union has been compared with the unfathomable union in which the Son of God, lives the life of His heavenly Father because, by means of the Eucharist, we should live the supernatural life of Jesus. As a result of this transformation, there can be no further place in us for sin, nor for disordered affectations and desires but only for virtue and for God.” -Antonio Cardinal Bacci (1881-1971)

CARLO ACUTIS **IN MANY WAYS, HE WAS JUST AN ORDINARY TEENAGER...**

Now, he’s set to be canonized!

He wore Nike shoes, loved sports, and was tech-savvy. In many ways, Carlo Acutis was just a regular teenager. But he was also exceptional. In fact, he is on his way to becoming the first millennial saint of the Catholic Church.

Just this past week, Pope Francis recognized the second miracle attributed to Blessed Carlo, paving the way for his likely canonization in 2025!

Carlo had a touch of genius in him. He began studying computer science textbooks when he was nine years old and taught himself computer programming and graphic design. He was also unusually devout. Although his parents did not go to Mass at the time, he fell in love with Jesus in the Blessed Sacrament and encouraged his family to practice the Faith. He became a daily Mass goer and exemplified the love of Christ to everyone he encountered, whether they were his schoolmates, family members, homeless people, or others.

Shortly before his death, he created a website that cataloged Eucharistic miracles and Marian apparitions in order to share them with others. Carlo’s mother said, “Carlo was the light answer to the dark side of the web.” She added that some admirers have called him an “influencer for God.”

On his site, he told people: “The more often we receive the Eucharist, the more we will become like Jesus, so that on this earth we will have a foretaste of heaven.”

Carlo died at the age of fifteen from acute promyelocytic leukemia. He had offered his sufferings for the pope and the Church. His body, which was exhumed for veneration this month, was displayed at a church in Assisi, Italy.

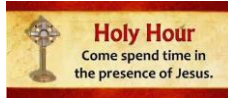
