

Yorkville Christian High School Completes Job Shadow Program with the Kendall County Sheriff's Office

In September 2016, the Kendall County Sheriff's Office partnered with Yorkville Christian High School for a job shadow program. The program gives students the opportunity to gain insight into law enforcement prior to entering college and deciding if they want to pursue a degree in law enforcement. The program will last for three months and give students the opportunity to spend time in all divisions of the sheriff's office.



On September 19, 2016, Alexandra began her job shadowing in the corrections division. Alexandra participated in ride-along with patrol deputies, spent some time in the records division, courthouse, and with the investigations unit. In January 2017, Alexandra requested an extension in the Job Shadow Program for an additional 3 months. In April 2017, she completed the Job Shadow Program.
