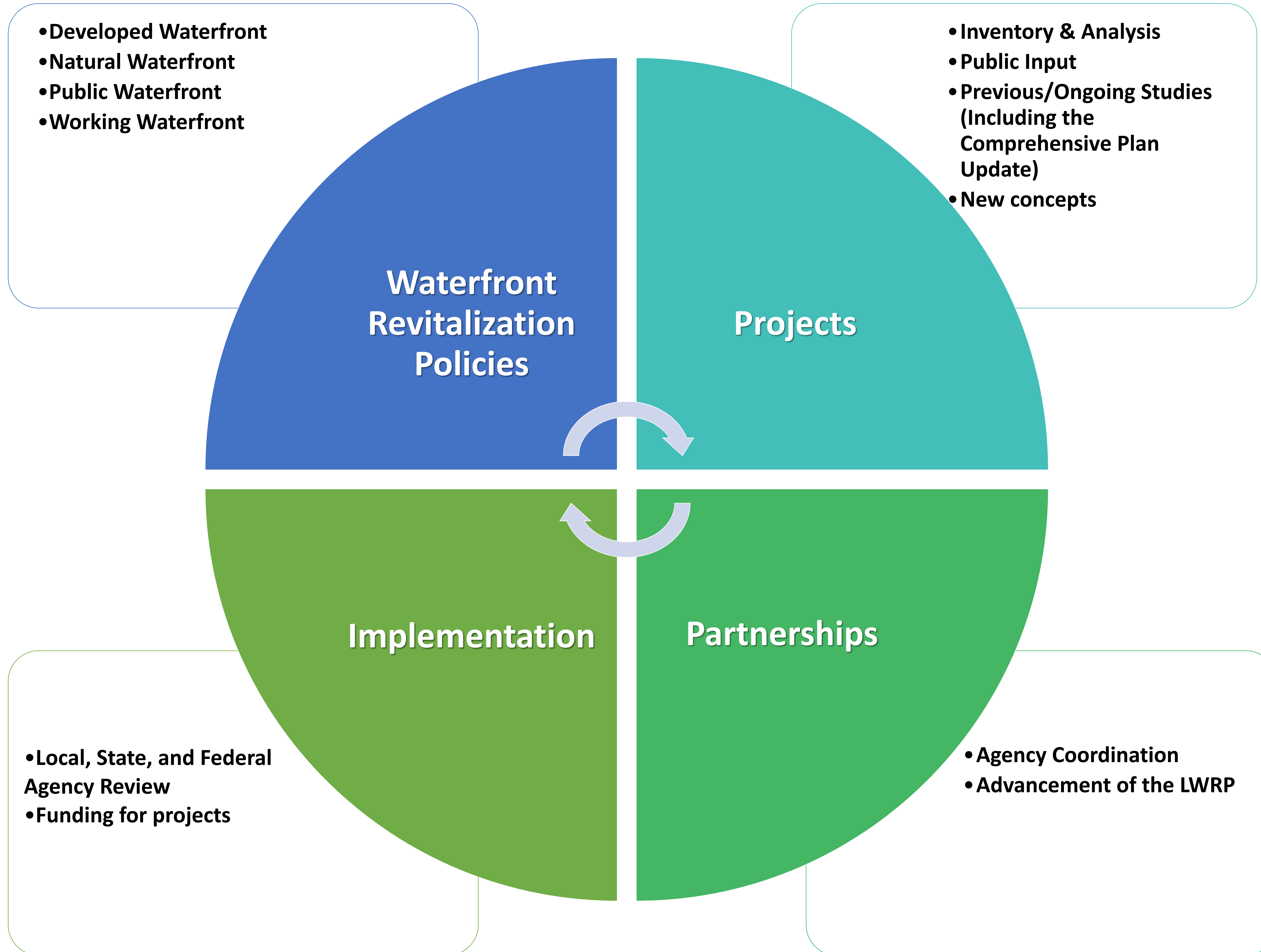




### COMPONENTS OF A LOCAL WATERFRONT REVITALIZATION PROGRAM





The CPU and LWRP will have a consistent set of visions, goals, objectives, policies and actions based on prior planning efforts, community input, documented conditions and current issues, projected changes, toward a resilient and sustainable future.

## LOCAL WATERFRONT REVITALIZATION PROGRAM

Policies and recommended actions are reviewed and approved by NYS Department of State (DOS) and other involved agencies, such as the Department of Environmental Conservation (DEC), Army Corps of Engineers (ACOE), or National Oceanic Atmospheric Administration (NOAA).

This gives the City of Long Beach greater oversight over actions within its boundaries and makes grant applications for implementation more competitive.

## COMPREHENSIVE PLAN UPDATE

Builds on prior planning efforts to identify opportunities to accelerate Long Beach's transition from post-Sandy recovery to a thriving and resilient community.

Stresses 'resilience' – the ability of the City and its residents to withstand and recover quickly from natural and economic instability with less impact – and integrates social, economic, and environmental actions into policy and project recommendations.
