### The Acmas Community Quilt

Children have always been an important part of our church in Acmar. During the coal mining days when married miners also brought their families to live in Acmar, there were Sunday school classes conducted on tables built by local handy men and two-week sessions of Vacation Bible School in the summers staffed by the wives and mothers. There was an active Boy Scouts troop. For a short period of time after the mines closed, there weren't very many children around to warrant many special activities. But as new people moved into the neighborhood in the 1950s and early1960s (and many of them were relatives), there were children in Acmar once again.

Now there was no official nursery or "Children's Church" like today. Children learned very early on how to behave appropriately at church during the Sunday morning service or run the risk of their mama getting in a firm pinch on the top part of their leg (which could be done without any others in the congregation being aware of this disciplinary measure.) As kids began to get a little older, it was a wise move to develop activities that encouraged their attendance and participation at church. This was a time during the alternating Baptist and Methodist Sundays, and everybody came every Sunday. A special time for the young people on Sunday evenings was called Training Union. One of the teacher/leaders was Dot Barefoot who lived in the house across from the church. She was a delightful lady loved by all the kids with her red hair and freckles and a real Southern drawl that was always firm, but fair. When Gordon Mize was the Baptist preacher his wife, Clara, was part of the Training Union bunch. There are sweet memories of hot summer Sunday evenings when Gordon and Clara would bring popsicles for all the young people at Training Union. (It's easy to imagine that attendance was pretty good!) Time passed. The Baptists and Methodists separated. There were fewer young people in the church. In 1968, a new minister, Elias Gurubel and his wife, Nelle, came to Acmar. They brought a new connection for Acmar: Wonder Book Camp. This became very special to some of the young people from Acmar, and the church still continues our affiliation with the camp.

The youth from Acmar at that time grew up and many married and/or moved away. For a few years, the sound of a young child was seldom heard at Acmar Church until the next generation came along. Once again, there was Sunday School, Bible School, and special activities for kids. In 1984, we established a MYF group (Methodist Youth Fellowship) that met at the church for fun and good fellowship. A new Boy Scout troop began meeting at the church bringing in many young boys from the Moody area. Now that generation has grown up, and a new small group of children bring their special joy and presence to the church family!
