# BIERI & BILLS CLAIM CADILLAC CROWNS

#### **BIERI BECOMES FIRST-TIME TOUR CHAMPION**

For Keaten Bieri, the wait is over. The talented right-hander from Letts, Iowa outdueled the competition at this month's tour stop to claim his first career GISBT championship. Over the past several seasons, Bieri had flirted with victory several times, but had always come up short – until now.

The outcome was decided in an exciting position round showdown with Anthony Mastroianni, who was also seeking his first tour title as well. The pair of competitors had pulled clear of the other match play finalists, setting up a championship match, which Bieri won 201-181. Prior to that match, the lead changed hands several times during the finals.

Bieri, 18, won 5 of his 8 matches, and averaged 221 for his 8 matches. For his 16 games, Bieri averaged 222.43. He was appearing in the 7th match play finals appearance of his career. For his title, he took home the \$750 championship check, the winner's plaque, and a permanent place on Champion's Row. Congratulations, Keaten!

#### VAN WYK CLAIMS RUNNER-UP

Trey Van Wyk turned up the heat late in qualifying to earn a spot in the match play finals, qualifying in 8th place. However, once the finals began, he had his best stuff, averaging 234.5 for his 8 games and surging from 8th into the runner-up spot. His performance garnered a \$600 payday.

The 2-handed lefty was returning to the match play finals for the 2nd time in his career, but the first since he finished 5th at the March 2019 event in Cedar Rapids – more than  $4\frac{1}{2}$  years ago. That was a memorable day in his career, as he became the youngest match play finalist in tour history – at age 11.

### MASTROIANNI IN BEST FORM OF CAREER

Anthony Mastroianni recorded the best finish of his career at this month's event. The righthander was within a whisper of grabbing his first GISBT win, but instead came away with a 3rd place finish. The Brooklyn, New York native was the top shooter for the qualifying round, averaging 224.62 for his 8 games, and leading the field into match play. There, he traded places atop the leaderboard with the eventual champion throughout the finals.

Mastroianni was unbeaten through his first 5 matches, but suffered 3 straight losses to finish his finals, and while he was close to grabbing his first tour crown, his position round loss to the eventual champ relegated him to 3rd place. The Brooklyn, New York resident took home a \$500 scholarship for his performance.

#### KIDD 4th IN FINALS DEBUT

Nicholas Kidd was this month's 4th place finisher. The right-hander from Kaneohe, Hawaii was in sharp form all day, and it resulted in a \$400 scholarship for his performance. This was Kidd's 3rd GISBT appearance, and his first match play finals.

#### SIDERS CONTINUES HOT START TO SEASON; FINISHES 5th

Kendric Siders has become one of the tour's top attractions so far in 2023-2024. The righthander from Eagle River, Alaska began his season with a win and a runner-up finish. He continued his hot hand this month by hauling in a \$350 scholarship by finishing in 5th place. He's the only tour member to qualify for all 3 match play finals so far this season, and he's banked a cool \$1,700 along the way.

### STALEY TAKES 6th

Levi Staley made his match play debut at this month's tour stop. The southpaw from Fruitland, lowa took home a \$325 scholarship by virtue of his 6th place finish.

#### PIKE PLACES 7th

Alex Pike took home a \$300 scholarship for his 7th place finish this month. The Sartell, Minnesota resident was appearing in his 3rd match play finals, and this month, he matched his highest tour finish, equaling his 7th place showing at last season's Tournament of Champions.

#### DOHAN CLAIMS 8th

Ian Dohan completed the boy's finals field this month. The lanky right-hander from Tampa, Florida earned a \$275 scholarship by finishing in 8th place. This was just his 2nd appearance in GISBT competition, and it marked his first trip into the match play finals.

### **BILLS DEFENDS CADILLAC TITLE**

A year ago, Marissa Bills took home her first GISBT championship – and it came at Cadillac XBC. Some say that title had an asterisk next to it, since a power outage caused the event to be cut short, cancelling the final 2 games of match play in what was up to that time a close battle between several players. At the time, Bills was on top, so she was awarded the title since the finalists were unable to finish the tournament.

This time out, she was taking no chances. The smooth-stroking right-hander from Marion, Iowa was near the top of the leaderboard throughout the event. Gabi Evans, another former tour champion, was Bills' major rival this time around, and when Evans defeated Bills in the 5th match, the outcome was now up for grabs.

The position round swung back and forth until a closing turkey pivoted the match in Bills' favor, with the final outcome being just a single pin – a 193-192 decision that allowed Bills to return to the GISBT Winner's Circle for the 2nd time. Bills won 5 of her 6 matches, and this was her 8th trip into the match play finals as well.

For her 14 tournament games, Bills averaged 212.21. She took home the \$500 championship prize as well as the winner's plaque. Congratulations, Marissa.

#### **EVANS CLAIMS RUNNER-UP**

Gabi Evans has been one of the tour's major success stories in recent years. This month, the talented righty from West Liberty, Iowa averaged 214.87 for her qualifying round, and that enabled her to lead the field into match play. She was appearing in her 15th match play finals as well.

Ultimately, her runner-up finish led to a \$400 payday.

#### DAY TAKES 3rd

Chloe Day returned to the match play finals for the 5th time in her career at this month's event. Hailing from Galesburg, Illinois, the 19 year-old earned a \$300 scholarship for her performance.

#### 4-TIME CHAMP MOORE FINISHES 4th

Rachel Moore was this month's 4th place finisher. The hard-throwing righty from Keokuk, Iowa took home a \$250 scholarship by virtue of her high finish. The 4-time GISBT champion was appearing in the 21st match play finals of her career.

#### ANDREWS EARNS 5th

Vicki Andrews was in great form at this month's tour stop. The 16 year-old was this month's youngest match play finalist, and her 5th place finish netted the right-hander from Indianola, Iowa a \$225 scholarship.

#### PUNTER PLACES 6th

Emma Punter rounded out this month's girl's finals field; she finished in 6th place. The Lockport, Illinois native was appearing in her 4th match play finals; she took home a \$200 scholarship for her efforts.
