Worship Prayer and Confession

We have covered the Entrance Rite and The Word in the liturgical order of worship. The transition from the Word to the next part of the service is for the congregation to recite together an Affirmation of Faith.

From about the middle of the first century onward, the followers of the Way struggled to define itself. The Jewish Synagogue had the scriptures, its tradition, and even scholars who were respected who wrote about the faith. As an offshoot of this faith community the question was, who are we and what do we believe? What differentiates us?

Soon competing statements of faith were being written or proposed to be the definitive explanation of the faith. Also, there were controversies about how to talk about the faith (Arianism, Docetism, and Gnosticism to name a few). Around 325 the Nicene Creed was adopted by an ecumenical council to be the true statement of faith. The Apostles' Creed is attributed to the 5th century and the Athanasian Creed to the 6th century. These three creeds are considered the only official statements of faith of the Lutheran Church. In our worship we generally recite the Apostles' Creed during low church time and the Nicene Creed during high church time (Feast Days, Advent/Christmas, Easter, and Pentecost).

The Affirmation of Faith, also known as The New Creed, that we sometimes use, comes from the United Church of Canada and was adopted by them in 1968. It was revised in 1980 and 1995. Here at FLC we have unofficially adopted this statement of faith because of its inclusive nature and its modern language.

The next part of the liturgy is the Prayers of the Church. These are prayers that are a response to the proclamation of the Word. They remind us that we are a missional church by remembering the larger church and its struggles, the creation in crisis, the governments of the word in conflict, those who are sick and alone, our own congregation and its place in our community, and especially the saints who have gone before us. These prayers call us to action to help heal the world.

Out of these prayers we are reminded that we are part of the problem, so we confess our sins. Confession was understood to be in two forms, individual and communal. Individuals would be invited to sit with the pastor sometime during the week to confess sins that are harming their hearts - then the pastor would offer forgiveness. Then, during worship the community would confess and receive forgiveness. In modern times we have just the one confession that is communal in nature, but with a moment of silence for people to reflect on their own sins. The acclamation of forgiveness is then made for the individual and the community.

This part of worship also has a transition point, the gathering of our gifts to be in service to God's mission in this place. More on that next week.





The peace of Christ be with you always.





COMMUNION


The body of Christ, given for you. The blood of Christ, shed for you.


