

Sunday Reflection – Nineteenth Sunday in Ordinary Time

God offers his people abundant life, but we can miss it. What is the bread of life which Jesus offers? It is first of all the life of God himself; life which sustains us not only now in this age but also in the age to come. The Rabbis believed that the father who missed the promised land also missed the life to come. God sustained the Israelites in the

wilderness with manna from heaven. This bread foreshadowed the true heavenly bread which Jesus would offer his followers. The bread which Jesus offers his disciples sustains us not only on our journey to the heavenly paradise, it gives us the abundant supernatural life of God which sustains us for all eternity.

When we receive from the Lord's table, we unite ourselves to Jesus Christ, who makes us sharers in his body and blood and partakers of his divine life. Jesus offers us the abundant supernatural life of heaven itself, but we can miss it or even refuse it. To refuse Jesus is to refuse eternal life, unending life with the Heavenly Father. To accept Jesus as the bread of heaven is not only life and spiritual nourishment for this world but glory in the world to come. When we approach the Table of the Lord, what do we expect to receive? Healing, pardon, comfort, and rest for our souls? The Lord has much more for us, more than we can ask or imagine. The principal fruit of receiving the Eucharist or Lord's Supper is an intimate union with Christ. As bodily nourishment restores lost strength, so the Eucharist strengthens us in charity and enables us to break with disordered attachments to creatures and to be more firmly rooted in the love of Christ. Do we hunger for the "bread of life"?

Saint of the Week ... St. Lawrence

While we know very little about St. Lawrence's life, he is one whose martyrdom made a deep and lasting impression on the early Church.

Lawrence was a Roman deacon, charged with responsibility for the material goods of the Church and distribution of alms to the poor. According to legend, when Lawrence knew he would be arrested, he sought out the poor, widows, and orphans of Rome and gave them all the money he had on hand, selling even the sacred vessels of the altar to increase the sum. When the prefect of Rome heard of this, he imagined that

the Christians must have considerable treasure. He sent for Lawrence and said, "I am told that your priests offer in gold, that the sacred blood is received in silver cups, that you have golden candlesticks at your evening services. Now, your doctrine says you must render to Caesar what is his. Bring these treasures; the emperor needs them to maintain his forces. God does not cause money to be counted: He brought none of it into the world with him - only words. Give me the money, therefore, and be rich in words."

Lawrence replied that the Church was indeed rich. "I will show you a valuable part. But give me time to set everything in order and make an inventory." After three days he gathered a great number of blind, lame, maimed, leprous, orphaned, and widowed persons and put them in rows. When the prefect arrived, Lawrence simply said, "These are the treasure of the Church."

The prefect was so angry he told Lawrence that he would indeed have his wish to die—but it would be by inches. He had a great gridiron prepared with coals beneath it, and had Lawrence's body placed on it. After the martyr had suffered the pain for a long time, the legend concludes, he made his famous cheerful remark, "It is well done. Turn me over!"

St. Lawrence's Feast is celebrated on August 10, the date of his death. He is the patron saint of cooks, deacons, and the poor.
