Please find enclosed your semi-annual water bill. Payments should be made out to the Village of Cohocton and mailed to PO Box 330, Cohocton, NY 14826. Can be made in person at the Village Office, 17 South Main Street, Cohocton. The office hours are Monday - Friday 9:00 am to 3:00 pm. Payments can be made online at www.villageofcohocton.com **A drop box is also** available at all times for your convenience.

Payment without interest must be received in the Village Office, or postmarked no later than Friday, November 3, 2017. Payments received November 4, 2017 thru December 3, 2017 must pay the 10% late amount shown on the **bill.** All unpaid bills after December 3, 2017 will be subject to water shut off.

*There will be no extensions granted after the shut off date. Payments can be made from the time you receive your bill until December 3rd. Do not call the office the day before the shut off date and expect to make payment arrangements.

To ensure you receive your water bill and Village tax bill on time, please contact the Village Clerk at 585-384-5252 of any address changes you may have.
