2016 Financial Report

For the 2016 financial year, which ended on September 30th, the pool reported a total operating income of \$318,067.95 (which reflects a \$45,000 transfer from the investment fund early in the year) and total expenses of \$304,501.60 (which reflects a late-year transfer of \$6,000 to the investment fund). The expenses included \$60,691.47 on improvements and upgrades such as a new white coat and underwater lights for the main pool, and WiFi throughout the property. The table below shows the 2016 income and expenses as well as the closing balances for the pool's checking account and investment fund.

Facilities and Maintenance

Important maintenance and safety issues were addressed during the past year:

- 1. Last Fall (November 2015) after the pool was closed, a new white coat was applied.
- 2. This Spring (April 2016) new in pool LED lights were installed.
- 3. Skimmer pads replaced (April 2016)
- 4. Powered Roof Vent for lower shed (July 2016)

Improvements:

- 1. Thanks to an Eagle Scout project, the volleyball court was replenished with 20 tons of sand.
- 2. WIFI access
- 3. Stainless Steel Refrigerator for the snack bar
- 4. Flat screen TV for snack bar

Future work that needs to be addressed includes snack bar counter tops and cabinet replacement.
