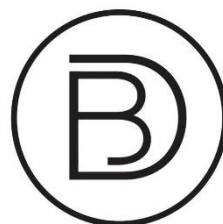

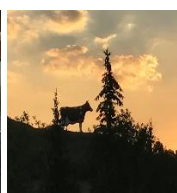

Drew grew up soaking up a variety of musical influences - Southern gospel greats The Cathedrals, country superstars Alabama and even Earth, Wind & Fire. Raised working on his grandfather's farm, singing in church on Sundays and playing sports have provided a strong foundation for Baldridge and have given him a deep well to draw from as a songwriter. "My music comes from a real place," says Baldridge, "and when people hear my songs, I think they'll realize this is who I am."

Music is best when it's authentic, when it comes straight from an artist's heart and bursts from the speakers. It makes a connection with the listener that forms an immediate bond. Drew Baldridge creates music with that kind of impact. The happy-go-lucky guy looking to get his groove on in his debut single "Dance with Ya" is the same Drew that enjoys visiting with fans after a show, and it's that kind of down home charm combined with a powerful voice and constantly-honed songwriting skills that make Baldridge one of country music's most promising new talents.

Opening for such acts as Dierks Bentley, Eric Church, Diamond Rio, Kellie Pickler, Cross Canadian Ragweed, and countless others. They are poised to be one of the most talked about bands of 2018. 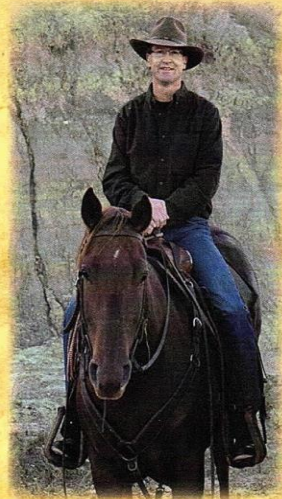

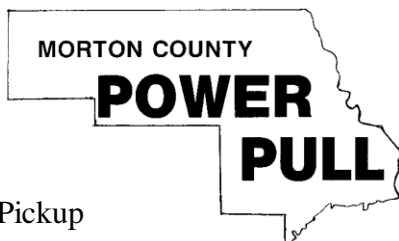

REQUESTED TESTING OF POULTRY:

Poultry Show will be held on Aug. 2nd of the Achievement Days/County Fair.

All poultry (chickens, ducks, geese and turkeys, i.e. anything with feathers) will need to be tested before being allowed to show at all fairs/achievement days in ND starting in 2013.

Should one or more of the poultry operations in ND experience a serious disease outbreak, federal indemnity to commercial and non-commercial poultry owners could be withheld, due to noncompliance with federal testing requirements and could be a serious financial loss to the state's poultry producers.

There may be spot checking of local fairs and the ND State Fair by state or federal employees.

Below are the requirements regarding the pullorum testing requirements for exhibition/show poultry.

1. Poultry purchased within 4 months are exempt from this testing requirement if they have been purchased from a NPIP flock and have not been mixed with other non-tested chickens. An example would be you purchased your chicks from TSC, Fleet-Farm or other NPIP suppliers. You can take the **Poultry Exhibition Statement of Origin form** available from the extension office or the ND Dept of Agriculture, have your dealer fill out the form and your set for showing. **These poultry will need to be banded.**
2. If you have older chickens (over 4 months old), then they will have to be tested **30 days** before showing.
3. All older chickens in your flock must be tested, even ones that will not come to the fair.
4. Testing must be performed by a certified person.
5. Once tested the bird must have a band attached to a leg, there are special bands available but for ease a plastic wire tie would work as long as it's been numbered, a fine tipped permanent marker could be used.

Jackie Buckley is a certified tester and is willing to test your birds. **All birds will need to be tested prior to July 15, 2018.** Please call Jackie Buckley at 701-391-7113.
