<p><b>Sat, May 5</b> <b>10:00 a, 2 hr</b></p> <p>Difficulty 2</p>	<p><b>Paddle – 1<sup>st</sup> section of Bearskin Creek</b> Canoe the Bearskin Creek from Goodnow to Harshaw. County Hwy K west of Rhinelander about 12 miles. Right(north) on Lakewood Rd about 4 miles to the 2<sup>nd</sup> creek crossing in Goodnow. <b>RSVP</b> Guy 715-360-4325(cell), 715-282-5810(land)</p>
<p><b>Fri, May 11</b> <b>10:00 a</b></p> <p>Difficulty 3</p>	<p><b>Hike – Giant Pine Trail</b> Hike the 2-mile Giant Pine Trail, a longtime favorite, south of Three Lakes. Enjoy seeing hundreds of year old pines in early spring, before the bugs are out. We will also stop at the Shelp Lake Parking area and do a visit by car and short walk to one of the oldest glacial boulders in the state. Ice cream or lunch afterward optional. Meet at the Three Lakes Winery parking lot on the corner of Hwy 45 and A by 10:00 am to drive together to NR2414 (Giant Pine Rd) off of Scott Lake Rd. <p><b>Wed, May 16</b> <b>5:00 p</b></p> <p>Difficulty 3</p>	<p><b>Paddle – Pelican River</b> Little George Creek Culvert on Hwy P about 7 miles east of Rhinelander at 5:00 pm. Some class 1 &amp; 2 rapids. Take out at River Bend Road about 7:00 pm depending on water level. <b>RSVP</b> Guy 715-360-4325(cell), 715-282-5810(land)</p>
<p><b>Sat, May 19</b> <b>10:00 a</b></p> <p>Difficulty 2</p>	<p><b>Hike – Northwoods Chapter Ice Age Trail Alliance Spring Wildflower Hike</b> In the beautiful hills and rolling hardwoods of the Harrison Hills in Lincoln County. Terrain will be hilly-moderately difficult. Bring a lunch and water to have on the trail. Meet at the Ice Age Trail head on Turtle Lake Road. Directions: Hwy 51 to Hwy J at Irma-go east on J-5 miles to Turtle Lake Rd. Go north 3 miles on Turtle Lake Road to Ice Age Trail Trailhead. Any questions contact Ruby Jaecks 715-551-1118</p>
<p><b>Thurs, May 24</b> <b>2:00 p</b></p> <p>Difficulty 2</p>	<p><b>Wildflower Hike – Luna-White Deer Trail</b> Hike along the shorelines of both Luna and White Deer Lakes in the Nicolet National Forest. From Eagle River, take State Hwy 70 east for 15 miles to Divide Road (FR2176). Turn right and go south 6 miles to Luna-White Deer Campground sign. Turn right into the campground. Park at the White Deer Lake swimming area. Trail length is a 4-mile loop. Level terrain, some small hills. <b>RSVP</b> Maren 715-490-3155(cell)</p>
<p><b>Sat, June 1</b></p> <p>Difficulty 2</p>	<p><b>Backpack – Chipmunk Falls area or Blackjack Springs area</b> We're planning a fun early summer short backpacking &amp; camping trip. Have your wanted to try backpacking or tune-up your skills. We're hosting an early summer hike. Here is an opportunity to develop your skills. Saturday we'll hike in about 2 miles &amp; then set up a wilderness camp. We'll have time enjoy the area. <p><b>Sat, June 16</b> <b>10:00 a</b></p> <p>Difficulty 1</p>	<p><b>Bike – 3 Eagle Bike Trail</b> Reiter Center, 8.4 miles to Sundstein Rd parking lot and return. Carpool from Menards or meet at Reiter Center in Three Lakes. <b>RSVP</b> Mary 715-282-5995(land), Sandy 630-251-4148(cell)</p>
<p><b>Wed, June 20</b> <b>1:00 p</b></p> <p>Difficulty 2</p>	<p><b>Paddle – Wisconsin River</b> Enjoy the quiet stretch of the Wisconsin River from Hat Rapids put-in to Camp 10 take-out. Don't forget your sunglasses, water, and sunscreen. Meet at Hat Rapids Dam. Drive Hwy 17 S to Hat Rapids Dam road. We will plan the take-out shuttle at Camp 10. <p><b>Sat, July 7</b> <b>2.5 hr</b></p> <p>Difficulty 1</p>	<p><b>Paddle – Deerskin River</b> Meander between wetland and forest. Meet at Menards to carpool. Hwy 70 East of Eagle River, north on Rangeline Rd (drop off parking when river crosses Rangeline), continue north to Deerskin Rd (right turn), to FS 2199 to right turn Brandy Shack Rd (pavement, to gravel, to put-in). <b>RSVP</b> Mary 715-282-5995(land), Bev 715-369-2567(land)</p>
<p><b>Sat, July 28</b> <b>10:30 a</b></p> <p>Difficulty 2</p>	<p><b>Hike – Blackjack Springs Wilderness-Whispering Lake</b> Wilderness area with four large, crystal-clear springs. Carpool from Menards or meet at Deerskin Snowshoe Trail parking lot. Hwy 70, approximately 7.5 miles east of Eagle River. <p><b>Wed, Aug 29</b> <b>11:00 a, 4+ hr</b></p> <p>Difficulty 2</p>	<p><b>Paddle – 4<sup>th</sup> Lake to Sunset Lake</b> Starts at 4<sup>th</sup> Lake, paddle to Sunset Lake, paddle to Birchwood Bar on 3<sup>rd</sup> Lake, have lunch, paddle back to 4<sup>th</sup> Lake down the north branch of pelican river. Round trip 8 mi. Meet at Dave &amp; Nancy Hansen’s home. Take Cty C east from Rhinelander – Go 6 miles from lights at ice arena. <p><b>Tue, Sep 11</b> <b>1:30 p</b></p> <p>Difficulty 2</p>	<p><b>Bike – Bearskin Trail</b> Meet at trailhead on County K.
