DACKOTAH MONTGOMERY - 11/7/1995 to 11/14/2013;

Dackotah was the daughter of Barb (Nelson) and Mark McMillen and Bobby and Lynn Montgomery. She attended Park and St. Anne's Elementary Schools and Le Sueur-Henderson (LSH) Middle and High Schools in Le Sueur. She was ready to graduate from LSH, June 1st, 2014. Dackotah died in a single car accident November 14, 2013. She was part of the High Step Science Academy at LSH and was preparing for college with the goal of studying law and becoming either a lawyer or a paralegal. A spirited and loving young lady, life involved the "right way", the "wrong way" and the "Dackotah way". She was extremely intelligent and strong. She was always there for anyone who needed her, whether to just listen and console, or to wisely advise. She loved to take her brother and her sister (or anyone else for that matter) to the park, pool or on an adventure.



She was very organized and loved helping residents at the assisted living where she worked to organize too. She also held jobs with LSH custodians and in Radermacher's deli. Dackotah loved camping, fishing, tubing, music, hanging out with her friends, helping out on a special friend's farm, practicing shooting her bow and arrow, family trips to the Wisconsin Dells, the Kansas City Speedway, McGregor, MN, Canada and most every other travel location. She will always be remembered for her bright blue eyes and huge engaging smile. She was loved by all and truly missed.

Katelyn was born to John Hank and Tanya Hagen in 1997. She attended Hilltop Elementary in Henderson and Le Sueur-Henderson middle and high schools in Le Sueur. Katelyn was a Junior at LSH when she passed away from injuries suffered during sledding accident on New Year's Eve 12-31-13.



Katelyn was very active in her community church. She enjoyed singing in the church choir, participating youth group and helping with Sunday school. From age 15, she worked at Pizza Ranch in Le Sueur. Katelyn enjoyed sports and was a Tennis Team Captain, Track Manager, and ran cross country. Her love of music made her a valuable member of the Marching and Pep Bands, Concert Choir and Swingin' Sisters. Katelyn loved singing, writing songs, and playing her guitar throughout the house. She was also actively involved in LSH speech and theater, including One Act plays and many competitions. An amazing artist Katelyn used her love of music, the outdoors and passion for animals to creatively express herself. Katelyn had the most loving heart for everyone she came in contact

with and was committed to serving others. She was a soft-hearted young lady who was always there for anyone that needed a friend no matter what she had going on - she always put them first :-).
