A Devotional for You ~ Read 1 John 1:5-9



You've probably heard me talk at length about the importance of small group community. I thought it important to go from the "grand sweeping view" to focus on a particular part – almost like a microscope to see one of the moving parts that make it so wonderful. The part I'm thinking of is *authenticity*. This is something the New Testament reveals is essential for our spiritual growth, and something sorely lacking in our post-modern

society. We live in a world where everyone's life is "on display" 24/7 with Instagram filters, Facebook profiles and viral hashtags. But the crazy irony is that all this stuff is leading to a fake authenticity (what we want people to see). Author Chris Surratt says this is "because there's a near-paralyzing fear that comes with true authenticity. The thoughts bombard us every time we start to grow in relationship with others. If people only knew ... the things I have done ... my shortcomings as a spouse ... my failures as a parent ... my private thoughts. But the beautiful and freeing truth of true authenticity is that being open and vulnerable to a group of people doesn't require waling in perfection; it requires walking in confession" (*Leading Small Groups: Gather, Launch, Lead, ch. 9*).

That's *not* just Surratt's *opinion*. The Apostle John lays out the same in the reading from his first epistle: "If we say we have fellowship with [God], yet we walk in darkness, we are *not practicing the truth*. But if we walk in the light – as God himself is in the light [*Trinity as perfect unity in community*] – we have fellowship with one another ... If we confess our sins, He is faithful and righteous to forgive us our sin and cleanse us." (HCSB)

Because of the blood of Jesus, we don't have to be afraid of confessing our sin – not because sin doesn't have consequences, but because through the gospel, we know we are forgiven. James talks about transparency at its best in his letter: "Confess your sins to one another, and pray for one another, so that you may be healed" (5:16 HCSB). This is a picture of someone who, convinced of the limitless grace and promised forgiveness of Jesus, lets themselves be seen, opens their heart to those who share the same trust. They lay themselves bare before others, not expecting shame or guilt, but instead expecting grace and healing. It's a crucial step on the road to holiness. The gospel both enables us to be truly transparent and compels us toward a greater end that lies beyond transparency – we start by "being real with each other" – but that's the means to the greater end – to be made holy by the Spirit, conformed into the image of Jesus Christ, to the glory of the Father. May that be true in our lives. ~ *Pastor Brian*





AV Corner:


After the Zoom meet and greet in spring 2020 I mentioned to Brian how encouraging it was to see a congregation that embraced technology. It was so refreshing to see a congregation of all ages put aside hesitation and fear of change to embrace the world of Zoom to ensure they could continue to worship together and support each other through a year like no other. You all should be very proud of yourselves for what you have learned to do to stay connected.

A year later we are now part of your family and Zoom is still with us. I joined the AV Team to help with running the Zoom aspect of worship so the rest of the AV Team can focus on the other aspects of worship. Though more and more of you are joining us in house to worship, Zoom will be with us for some time to come. The AV Team thought it might be good to share some tips and tricks of Zoom.

For our phone in users, you may have noticed that occasionally the sound goes quiet just as a choir anthem is about to start. If the choir is using a CD for the background music, we need to turn off the sound. We do not have the license to broadcast recorded music over Zoom. Once the anthem is over you should start hearing the service again.

The first thing every Zoom user needs to know is that Zoom looks and acts differently depending on what device you are using it. Zoom on a laptop looks different than on a PC, a phone, an iPad or other tablet. The below tips are very general, and the photos may not perfectly match how your Zoom looks. We have also learned that not every tip and trick work on every device. We would like to encourage you to take the tips below as reference points and try them on your system. Do not be afraid to explore the different buttons on the Zoom screen.

Down in the bottom left corner you may see these two symbols. and connect with the audio your microphone on your device is a red line through it. Be aware that the microphones on devices the other Zoom participants can hear you, your TV, your dog, conversations to other people in the room with you. You can




When you join worship active, there will not be are very sensitive and you whispered mute yourself by

clicking the microphone button. At the start of worship, the Zoom host mutes all participants, and the little microphone will now have a red slash through it. This makes sure that all background noise is turned off and worship can begin. When worship is done you can click on the microphone again and the red slash will disappear, and your microphone is live again and you can be heard again by any of the other Zoom participants. The Zoom host can mute you at any time but only YOU have the power to unmute yourself, the host cannot do that for you.

The video icon controls whether we can see you or not. You are the only one who can control if your video shows you live and in color or if only your name shows up to the other Zoom participants. You control this feature with the same click on, click off process.


When you log in to Zoom your screen may look a bit like the Brady Bunch opening scene. All the participants in smaller squares across your screen. Or it may be one big box with lots of little boxes above it or to the side. When worship starts the Zoom host puts a spotlight on the main speaker which should make Pastor Brian or any other speaker at the pulpit the largest picture on your screen. When the AV team starts to share the slides that are on the screen in the sanctuary the speaker may go small again and either be at the top of your screen or on the side. To make sure you always see the speaker you can change

your view. In the top right hand corner you should see something like this



Clicking on the "Side-by-side: Speaker" will remove all the other little boxes and show you just the worship slides and the speaker in a small box next to the speaker.

Click on the icon and a menu should show up that le



If the grey line comes up move your curser right on top of it, keep the left mouse button down, or use your finger if you have a touch screen, try different things to see if you can move that line to the left which will then make the picture of the speaker larger and the worship slides smaller.
