DESCRIPTION: The Gordon Brothers (Clan Gordon) owned the Gordon Plastics company. The Gordon brothers were lifelong hunting enthusiasts which motivated them to design and build their own line of bows - "Gordon Royal Bows." Their bows performed so well with their fiberglass limbs that bow makers started purchasing Gordon laminates for their lines. In 1973 Browning purchased the bow manufacturing operation outright. Gordon then refocused on producing Bo-tuff laminate for general use within the archery industry. Root, Shakespeare, Bear, Wing, and Ben Pearson were just some of the companies that used Gordon laminate for their limbs. Today, Gordon Composites still produces fiberglass laminate, and solid glass billet material for the majority of bows manufactured worldwide.

This Gordon Knight is a great looking and performing re-curve, and was one of Gordon's higher end bows. This one is an exceptional shooter. It is really fast and accurate. Multi-laminated riser. Bow has no delamination; no cracks; limbs are straight. Overlays and tips are in great condition. 2 filled sight screw holes on the face of the bow that are barely noticeable (see pic on last page). No drilled holes; No chips, dings or cracks. No stress lines or crazing. A few minor scratches and nicks here and there. Some discoloration of the limbs. Decal is in fair shape. This bow was put to a stress test (held at full draw for 16 hours to make sure the old glues still held and no stress cracks developed. Then taken to the range and shot. Comes with a new rug rest and side plate, and a new string.
