# **Religious Education Connection**

### The Twelve Days of Christmas

December 25-January 5

We all sing the song, but do we know what the gifts given over the twelve days represent?

1) A partridge in a pear tree--The tree represents the following: the Tree of Life in the Garden of Eden, the proverbial tree of the Jewish people into which Jesus was born and lived and died, and the growth of the Church under the leadership of the Apostles. Jesus once spoke to his disciples of the mustard seed, which grows to become large enough for the birds to nest within. The partridge is a bird willing to sacrifice its life to protect its young.

- 2) Two turtle doves--The Old Testament and the New Testament. The dove is also a symbol of peace.
- 3) *Three French hens*--The Theological Virtues of Faith, Hope, and Charity.
- 4) Four calling birds--The four Gospels: Matthew, Mark, Luke, and John.
- 5) Five golden rings--The first five books of the Old Testament, the books of the Law or Torah.
- 6) Six geese-a-laying--The six days of creation.
- 7) Seven swans-a-swimming--The seven gifts of the Holy Spirit.
- 8) *Eight maids-a-milking--*The Beatitudes.
- 9) Nine ladies dancing--Of the twelve Fruits of the Holy Spirit, nine are found in one verse, Galatians 5:22.
- 10) Ten lords-a-leaping--The Ten Commandments.
- 11) Eleven pipers piping--The eleven faithful apostles.
- 12) Twelve drummers drumming--The twelve points of belief in the Apostle's Creed.


