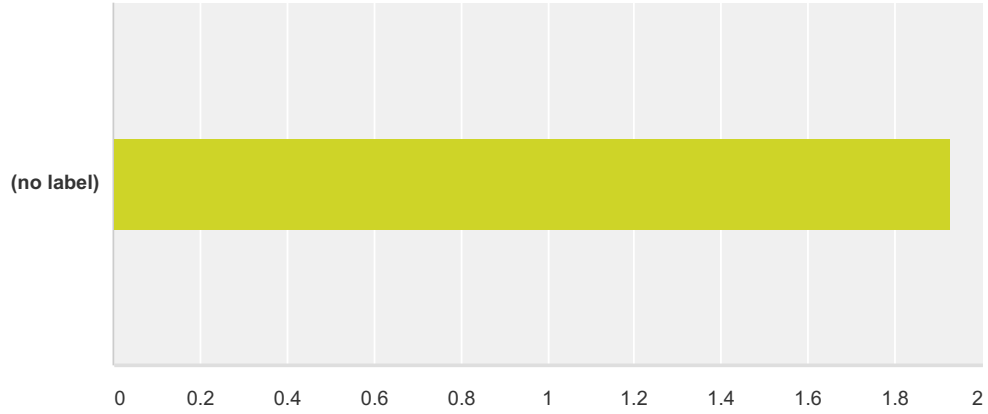


### Q1 How familiar are you with Voucher Systems/ESAs (Educational Savings Accounts)/?

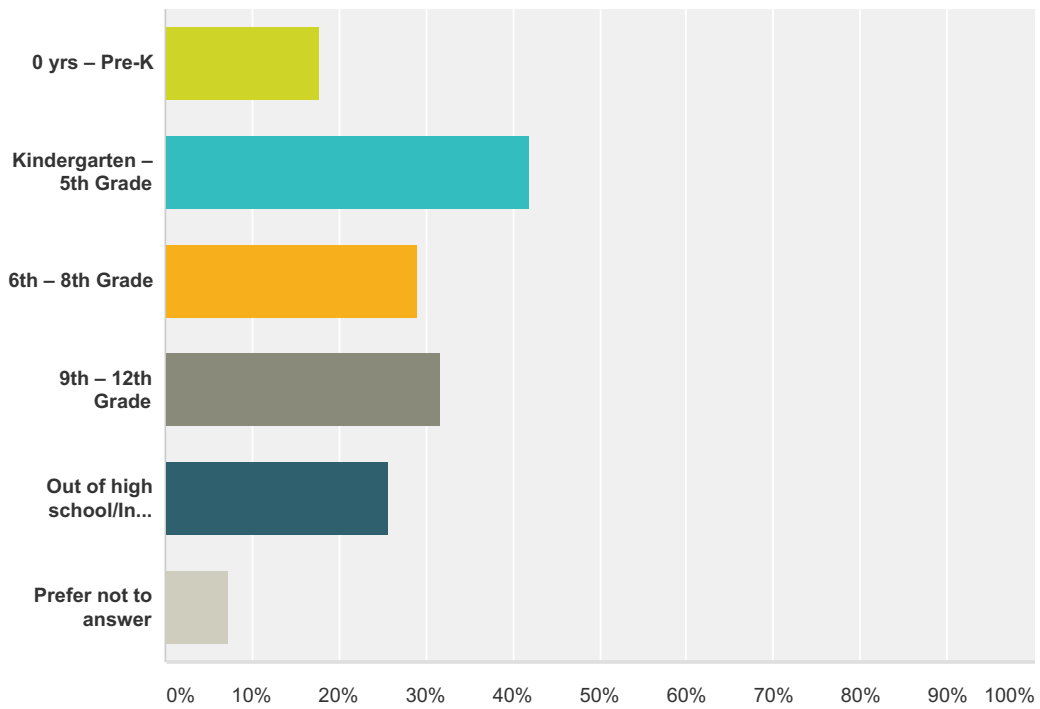

### Q2 What are the ages/grades of your children? (check all that apply)

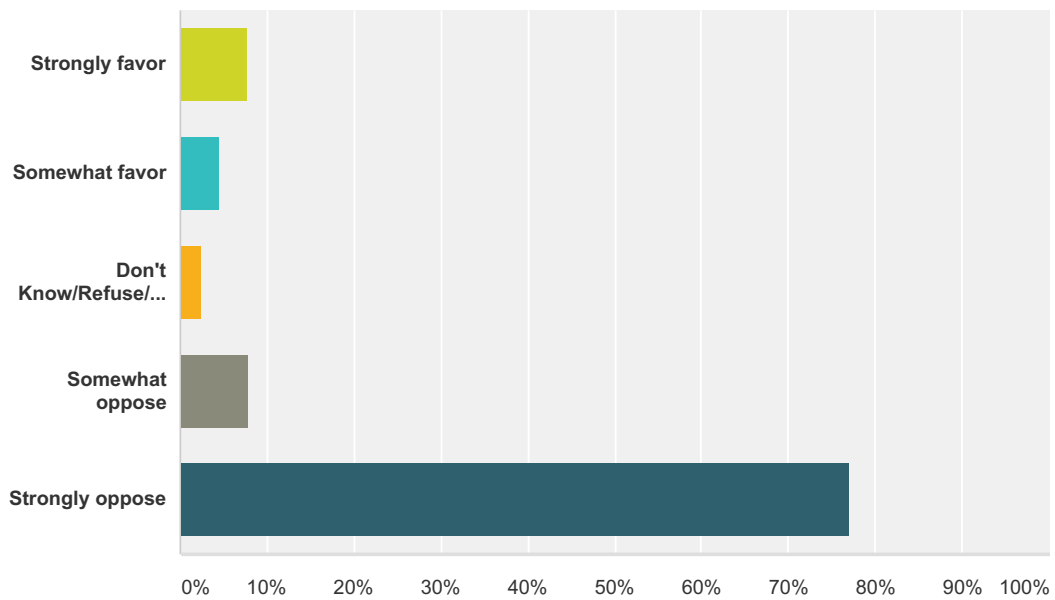

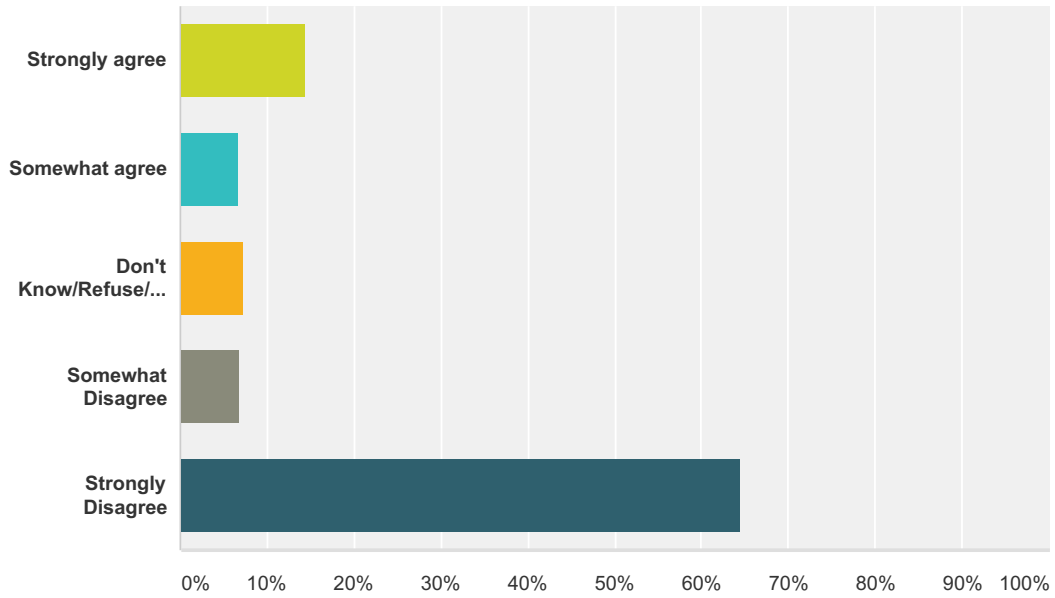

**Q4 Some people believe that ESAs should be available to all families, regardless of incomes and special needs. Would you AGREE or DISAGREE with that statement?**

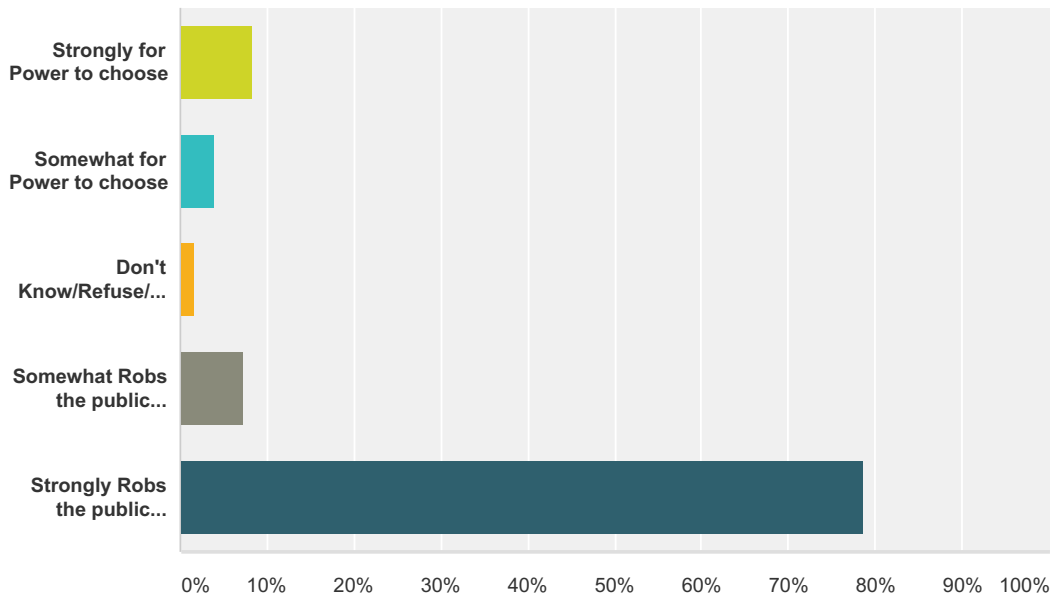

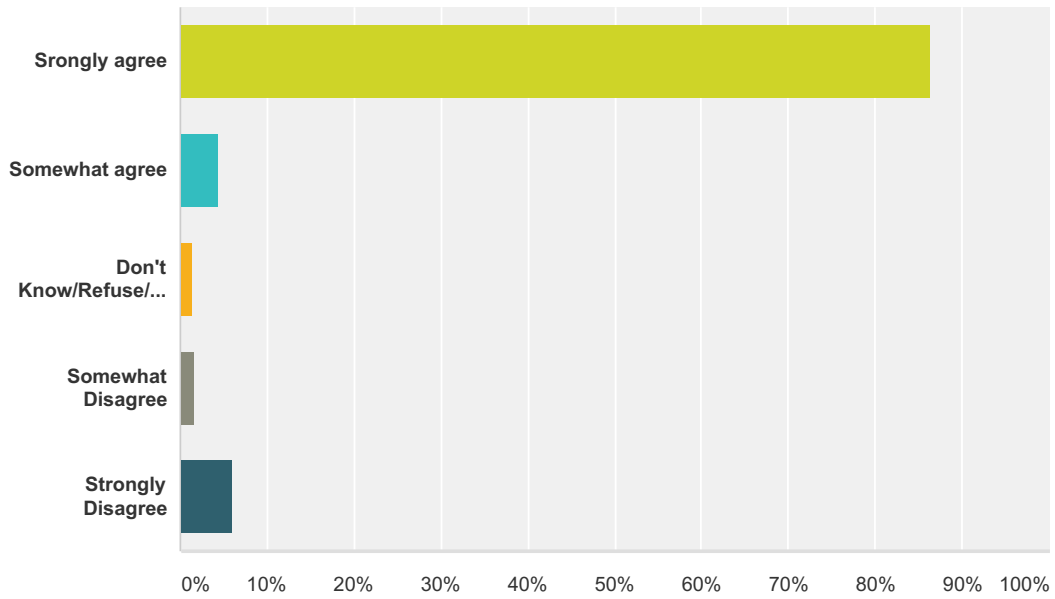
