We have much to be thankful for after our first year of the Americanism Committee. We made the town's Independence Day Parade a reality, without us, it would not have happened! We also supported other parades and patriotic celebrations. The Scout Troop continues to thrive. Our book swap is established and operating, and the flag recognition program is getting underway. We have accomplished a lot during our first year of Post 245 Americanism and we look forward to continuing to share PURE AMERICANISM and PATRIOTISM with the community:

- The flyers for the American Legion Essay contest have been released and are available on the Post's Social media sites and online through the Department Website. The topics are "Can Social Media Affect Someone's Life?" for middle school (6-8 Grade, http://pa-legion.com/wpcontent/uploads/2024/08/2025-Essay-Brochure-6-7-8-grades.pdf) and "Is the American Dream Still Relevant Today?" for High School (9-12 Grade, http://pa-legion.com/wpcontent/uploads/2024/08/2025-Dept.-Essay-brochure-9-12-grades.pdf). Post member Chuck Brickell has graciously agreed to provide \$3000 in recognition again this year. The flyer for the oratorical contest (https://pa-legion.com/wp-content/uploads/2024/08/2025oratorical-brochure.pdf) has been distributed to the principals of State High, Saint Joseph's Catholic Academy, and Grace Prep and local homeschool groups. Last year we had no entries at the Post or District level. This is a national contest with the winner receiving a \$25,000.00 scholarship in addition to prizes accrued along the way to the national level. The principals of the local public, private and charter schools in the State College Area School District have been contacted and sent the flyers for the age-appropriate essay and oratorical contests. The information has also been posted on local homeschool Facebook pages. BSA Troop 245 Corner

The American Legion BSA Troop 245 has had a very busy summer. In addition to attending summer camp at Camp Bashore, we also went on a city trip to Washington DC where we visited the National monuments and the Air and Space Museum. We had a group of 6 scouts and 3 leaders attend Philmont High Adventure Camp, where they backpacked 75 miles over 12 days through the New Mexico Wilderness. We climbed several mountain ranges including Mt. Phillips, elevation 11,711 feet and Tooth of Time, elevation 9,003 feet, and Comanche Peak at 11, 320 feet. As a troop, we have been working on the Hiking Merit Badge and have completed two 10-mile hikes. We took a one-night backpacking trip in Black Moshannon. At our August Court of Honor, we had 13 scouts advance in rank (3 Tenderfoot, 4 Second Class, 5 First Class, and 1 Star) and awarded 86 merit badges. We have helped out with a variety of service projects including the Fourth of July Parade, Fall Fest at the Legion, raising and lowering the American flags at Pine Hall Cemetery, Back to Scouts Night for Pack 383, and Scouting for Food. We recently held a recruiting event called "Scouting in the Woods" for a group of Webelos Cub Scouts looking to crossover to Boy Scouts.

In the upcoming months we will be attending a ropes course to do some team building at Camp Kanesatake, attending Klondike Derby at Seven Mountains Scout Camp, and skiing at Holiday Valley. In December, we will hold our winter Court of Honor to recognize individual scout achievements.

Finally, we were awarded the Scouting Unit of the Year award from the Pennsylvania American Legion. We received a special plaque which will be hung with our other scout plaques in the big room at the Legion. Please check out our new bulletin board display in the back of the big room to see upcoming events, scout achievements, and other troop news.
