Just a reminder to make your checks for name tags, meals, membership, anything written for club activities to RWCNC. This is all the bank will accept.





A new Volunteer Opportunity is here...already!

On top of the highest gas tax and car tax in the nation, CA politicians now want to impose a new "Mileage Tax" to charge drivers 6-cents per mile – or an additional \$900/year. When you add on the existing gas tax and car tax a typical family can spend over \$3000 in taxes to just drive on the roads in California.

Nationally, Democrats are licking their chops, hoping to force this mileage tax on all Americans coast to coast. At first the tax will be 6 cents per mile, but how long will that last? Once Democrats get their snoots in this new tax trough, they will suck it dry and want more.

Their plan is to make driving so expensive that people will be forced onto the bus. Never mind that it's raining and you have to carry your groceries half a mile. Or that there are no security guards on the bus. Seniors, the disabled and young women alone are especially at risk if there is no security.

Once again, the Democrats are the party of the rich elites who don't have to worry about paying \$900 extra per year. Republicans don't support the mileage tax because it is unfair. Drivers that buy gasoline already pay road repair taxes at the pump and people on a fixed income or that drive for a living can't afford it.
