DID YOU KNOW....

Why does California not have hurricanes while they occur on the East Coast at the same latitude? The reason is because hurricanes form over warm water, needing greater than 82° to mature from a tropical storm.

Hurricanes on the East coast form in the lower Atlantic, the Caribbean or the Gulf of Mexico. They have hurricanes even when its winter! This is due to the Gulf Stream warming up the cold Atlantic! These are usually called Nor'easters and bring freezing rain and snow along with the hurricane winds!

On the West Coast, water is not warm enough until about 1/2 way down Mexico or way out near Hawaii. Hurricanes forming in the Pacific cannot sustain their winds over cold water and either die out before getting to California or push further west where the ocean is warmer before heading north and dying out.

It is extremely unlikely we will ever have a hurricane even with global warming, though water spouts and other storms are likely. Waterspouts are tornadoes that form over water, or move from land to water, often with lightning and thunderstorms along for the ride!

COAST HWY REDEVELOPMENT PLAN APPROVED

The plan will reduce what is currently four lanes of vehicle traffic into two lanes with the other two lanes designated for parking and bicycle traffic. Council directed staff to look at starting the four lane segment at Oceanside Blvd instead of Morse St, as now currently approved. The project will now move to the Coastal Commission, then the City will have to come up with a way to fund it through various grants including SANDAG.
