

# It Has Pleased the Father to give you the Kingdom!

Today's Gospel follows on from the last week's teaching of Jesus concerning right attitudes to this world's possessions and priorities. "Get yourself treasure that will not fail you." And that treasure – the hospitality and love of God being offered to all has been revealed in the life of Jesus.

The Gospel begins with Jesus words of comfort and assurance. **"Do not be afraid".** His are the words of an older, compassionate brother, one whose heart is wrenched by the thought of the trials his friends may face.


Jesus reminds them that God's gift of the kingdom is already with them now in spite of life's challenges to come. He reminds them not to let worldly preoccupations to distract them. This is not easy when so much of our material survival is ruled by money, taxes, education, travel – not to mention food and clothing. Even worrying about the security of what we do have or the personal security of ourselves and others dear to us can eat away at us. These are all traits of human living. But Jesus reminds us, "Where is your heart?" Is it acquiring more and more - or do our lives and interactions model the Hope in God's promise.

There follows a parable of service. Jesus compares God to a master who is also a servant. Similarly the authority of discipleship must be patterned on God who is not remote and distant but in intimate relationship with humanity - who feels the sufferings and uncertainties of his people and encourages and supports, so that they recognise their dignity and empowerment as children of a loving God.

With God as the model of servant leadership so the church is to model servant leadership to the world and we who are disciples are to be mindful of this whatever our position in the church. As the reading from Wisdom and the letter to the Hebrews affirm, faith in the promise of God incarnate in the person of Jesus compels us to hope. Hope finds expression in love which humbly listens to the concerns, fears, joys of humanity and stands with the injured, the abused, the dis-spirited and the poor.

The Christian way is a way of faith which enables us to go forward as a community that embraces others with respect, hospitality and compassion. This was and is the way of Jesus and therefore surely must be the way of present and future leadership in the Church.

The fact is the Church has a treasure to share with people and when it shares that treasure the response will be enlivening and encouraging


#### Garden Working Bee

These requirements of volunteers are just one -but an essential part of our united commitment to creating and maintaining a culturally safe environment for the young and the vulnerable in which they feel safe, heard and respected.

#### FIFTH PLENARY COUNCIL OF AUSTRALIA INTEGRAL ECOLOGY AND CONVERSION FOR THE SAKE OF OUR COMMON HOME

During the conclusion of the Australian Plenary Council the following motion was affirmed on the  $7^{th}$  July 2022.

7. THEREFORE, this Plenary Council:

- recognises the sacred duty to care for and protect the Earth as a common home for all God's creatures, including the generations to come;
- encourages all Catholic people, families, parishes, dioceses, eparchies, religious institutes, educational institutions, and other Catholic organisations to accept Pope Francis' invitation to join the *Laudato Si'* Action Platform and either develop *Laudato Si'* Action Plans, or participate in existing *Laudato Si'* Action Plans, as a vehicle for their ecological conversion; and
- 3. promotes initiatives in Church and society which promote and defend human life from conception to natural death, especially those who are most vulnerable.

#### SECOND READING

Hebrews 11:1-2,8-19

Only faith can guarantee the blessings that we hope for, or prove the existence of the realities that at present remain unseen. It was for faith that our ancestors were commended.

It was by faith that Abraham obeyed the call to set out for a country that was the inheritance given to him and his descendants, and that he set out without knowing where he was going. By faith he arrived, as a foreigner, in the Promised Land, and lived there as if in a strange country, with Isaac and Jacob, who were heirs with him of the same promise. They lived there in tents while he looked forward to a city founded, designed and built by God.

It was equally by faith that Sarah, in spite of being past the age, was made able to conceive, because she believed that he who had made the promise would be faithful to it. Because of this, there came from one man, and one who was already as good as dead himself, more descendants than could be counted, as many as the stars of heaven or the grains of sand on the seashore.

All these died in faith, before receiving any of the things that had been promised, but they saw them in the far distance and welcomed them, recognising that they were only strangers and nomads on earth. People who use such terms about themselves make it quite plain that they are in search of their real homeland. They can hardly have meant the country they came from, since they had the opportunity to go back to it; but in fact they were longing for a better homeland, their heavenly homeland. That is why God is not ashamed to be called their God, since he has founded the city for them.

It was by faith that Abraham, when put to the test, offered up Isaac. He offered to sacrifice his only son even though the promises had been made to him and he had been told: It is through Isaac that your name will be carried on. He was confident that God had the power even to raise the dead; and so, figuratively speaking, he was given back Isaac from the dead. The Word of the Lord
