

## Minutes of September 9, 2019 BCCA Public Meeting

Meeting convened at 7:32 by president Koszyk

The Pledge of Allegiance was recited.

Minutes of the August meeting were read by Secretary Conley, Jackie Hodgkiss moved to change the date of the Christmas Bazaar, as noted, to November 16, which motion was approved. Minutes were approved corrected.

### Trustees report:

Mark Thomas stated that he had asked for a copy of the Century Link Bill for review. The bill is higher than expected as fees have gone up. Mark is looking for way to replace the landline with an internet line to save money. After discussion of the pros and cons of landline vs internet and the cost savings, a motion was made and voted by the majority to keep the phone system as is.

### Ways & Means:

1. Calendar dates are planned for 2020, discussion to add a 4<sup>th</sup> of July Parade. It was decided not to add the parade to the calendar but to announce a parade well in advance.
2. Yard sale Friday and Saturday, September 13 & 14 , Friday volunteers are Linda Arnold and Joanne Koszyk. Saturday volunteers are Linda Glavis, Lois Baker, and Sherry Thorpe. Breakfast and lunch will be served. Jackie Hodgkiss will cover the funds needed for the yard sale and kitchen.
3. Friday Oct 4th is Music of the Mountains: Mark and Maryanne Thomas and Mary McLaughlin will be in the kitchen.
4. Fall dinner on Saturday November 9th is a Veterans Dinner and will be free to all Veterans. Families will pay \$12 per dinner.

5. A Hunter's Dinner tentatively scheduled for November 23rd. Dinner will be confirmed with Robert Hupman.
6. November 16th is the Christmas Bizarre from 9-3. The community center is booked full.
7. A picture of the Quilt is needed in order to print the raffle tickets. Tickets could be sold at the yard sale, Music of the Mountains, and the Christmas Bizarre.
8. Sabrina Sinclair with Girl Scouts requested to use the community center on October 25th, 26th, and 27th for a haunted house fundraiser for her troop. After discussion, Sabrina's request is denied.

### **Old Business**

1. BCCA wants to begin holding Movie Nights. October 25th is chosen for the next movie night. Title to be determined.
2. Joanne Koszyk passed around sample mugs that Mark (Koszyk) found online; they would use a bear graphic and Browntown Community Center, Browntown VA, \$2.96 per mug, one-time setup fee of \$40.00, \$359 for 108 mugs. Could sell for \$10. After discussion of different types of mugs vs price. Vote to order, approved.
3. BCCA wants to purchase our own popcorn machine for movie nights. Brand new machine for \$132.00, tabletop size, and can be used for different events. Motion to purchase popcorn machine, vote to purchase, all in favor.
4. Discussion of what to do with the left over yard sale items; all items must be removed by the Monday following the yard sale. Jackie Hodgkiss will call Hospice, Margie Conley will call Salvation Army and Goodwill for pick up.
5. Mary McLaughlin appreciates whoever took down fence; fence was taken down by Neil Pennington. There are concerns that people are now parking on the church grounds, no parking signs are needed.
6. Follow up on the trees in front of the community center; they were examined by Wes Deavers; they are affecting the foundation and should be removed. Neil Pennington will remove the trees.
7. Mary McLaughlin stated the puzzles are ready; 1 was purchased for Christmas bizarre and 1 for the Red Bud festival. Puzzles are from the cover of the 2020 calendar.
8. Mary (McLaughlin) has not heard back about getting the railroad ties for the flower beds.
9. Allen Brockway inquiries who to contact about getting guardrails on the 4100 block Browntown Rd on the west side. Linda (Glavis) will follow up.
10. Announcement made regarding the GM raffle at the Festival of Leaves.
