What is the Blue Hill Corridor Panning Commission (BHCPC) ?

The Blue Hill Corridor Planning Commission (BHCPC) is a community-owned and community-driven initiative of the Black Economic Justice Institute. This initiative is currently being developed to find solutions to the problems facing residents, businesses, institutions and other stakeholders that live and work along (and near) Blue Hill Avenue stretching from Roxbury's Dudley Street to Mattapan Square.

“The mission of the Blue Hill Corridor Planning Commission (BHCPC) is to bring cohesiveness along the corridor so to reflect the thoroughfare it is versus the present disjointed manner in which city services are delivered and economic development decisions are being made. We aim to become a united voice to bring the business, residential, community and faith-based organizations together to have input in all development and planning initiatives regarding but not limited to Economic Development, Jobs, Education, Housing, Health and Public Safety issues along the corridor. Our overall objective is to ensure that we as a community are better informed, and included in matters that directly impact us.”
