

#### Minutes of OPENA General Meeting on May 21, 2019

The meeting was called to order at 6:40 pm by President Tom Forsyth.

Tom introduced the assistant pastor for St. Augustine, Buddy Apple, who welcomed everyone and mentioned the fact that his church offers a community luncheon on the third Saturday of each month. He invited us all to attend the next one on June 15<sup>th</sup> at 12:00 noon.

The meeting proceeded with Tom noting that the attendance was excellent. Actual count revealed that 84 people were present. Tom worked through the agenda items and outlined the pertinent events planned included:

- i) District 4 runoff forum, set for May 23rd at Friendship West Baptist Church
- ii) Neighborhood cleanup, rescheduled for May 25th, 9 to 11am.
- iii) Mayoral candidate forum on May 28<sup>th</sup> at Methodist Central, 6 8 pm.

Patsy Brown outlined plans for the June 1<sup>st</sup> picnic. At this point we needed a person to loan his/her grill to prepare hot dogs and volunteers to setup and cleanup the premises. Residents were encouraged to sign up at the volunteer desk.

The minutes for the March 19<sup>th</sup> meeting were read and approved. Joe Lucas moved for adaption while Judy Pollock seconded the motion.

The financial status was presented. Currently we have a total balance of \$1779.

Currently the organization has four projects under consideration for Grants through Heritage Oak Cliff. The total cost for these projects is \$4518. With approval of our grant requests, our outlay will be \$ 1807. Application has been made to Heritage Oak Cliff for financial support. The projects that we have submitted for the grant include:

- 1. Project 1 Neighborhood Improvement Grant to Purchase & Install Sign Toppers for Druid Hills Neighborhood.
- 2. Project 2 Neighborhood Improvement Grant for the Marketing of OPENA.
- Project 3 Neighborhood Improvement Grant to Purchase Audio Visual Equipment for OPENA Meetings & Events Project.
- 4. Project 4 Community Building Grant to help fund OPENA Social Events & General Meetings.

President Tom then gave justifiable reasons for the organization to file for a 501-C3 status. After this a motion was call to vote on the issue. Joe Lucas moved and Ann Herbridge seconded a motion to adapt 501-C3 status. The motion was approved unanimously.

Grant Amount: \$ 2,024.92

**Net OPENA Funds:** \$ 2,592.48

- HOC provides grant money for neighborhood projects as follows:
  - Up to 60% of the grant request on Neighborhood Improvement Grants
  - A maximum of \$500 on Community Building Grants.
- Awards will be made in June 2019.
- OPENA has up to 18 months from the date of the grant award to spend the money in order to be reimbursed by Heritage Oak Cliff.








## Community Crime Map




